Town Office Notes

Dog Licenses

Dog Licenses are due April 1st. A current rabies certificate is required. If you are unsure if the current certificate is on file, please call the town office. For your convenience, you may mail or drop off the fee and rabies certificate along with a self-addressed stamped envelope and your license will be mailed to you. The fee until April 1st is \$10.00 for spayed or neutered dogs and \$12.00 for dogs that are not spayed or neutered. Dog licenses obtained after April 1st are subject to a late fee.

The Vermont Tax Department is no longer sending income tax booklets to the town office. There are 3 ways you can get your state income tax forms:

Spring Yard Clean Up

Spring has arrived and eventually it will feel it! When cleaning up your yard, please keep in mind:

- Burn permits are required prior to any burning. Burn permits are available online (<u>www.westfordvt.us</u>), from the Fire Warden (Dennis Angiono, 879-1231) or from the Town Office during regular office hours.
- Yard waste, such as leaves, brush and topsoil are not considered household garbage, therefore Gauthier
 Trucking will not collect these materials when picking up your garbage. You can compost yard waste or
 bring it to a participating CSWD drop off center. For a list of centers please visit www.cswd.net.
- Mark your calendars: The CSWD Rover will be accepting household hazardous waste on July 27th in Westford. More information about this free service will be forthcoming in the May newsletter.

IMPORTANT CHANGES TO TOWN NEWSLETTER DISTRIBUTION ACTION REQUIRED

In an effort to save taxpayers money, the Selectboard has decided to change the way the newsletter is distributed. Given today's technology, the newsletter is available electronically by email and on the Town's website, therefore mailing of hard copies will be limited to those who contact the Town Office to request to be put on the mailing list. This change goes into effect for the July Newsletter.

PUBLIC NOTICE VACANT TOWN POSITIONS

The Selectboard is accepting applications for the following positions that were not filled at the 2014 Town Meeting elections:

- * Town Auditor Town auditors play a vital role by ensuring that local officials are accountable for their expenditures of taxpayer's money. It is the auditor's job to review the accounts of local officials and report the findings directly to the taxpayers for review. You do not have to have an accounting degree to be a town auditor. The auditors meet monthly to balance the bank statements and review accounts in preparation for the annual town report. Hours are flexible. This is a very part time position with hourly compensation.
- * Town Grand Juror The grand juror is responsible for inquiring into and providing information to the property authorities of criminal offenses that may occur in the town in which he/she lives. This office is mostly obsolete because the state's attorneys provide most of these services in local communities. However, because the position has not been deleted from state statute, the position remains to be filled by election (or appointment by the Selectboard if no one is elected).
- * Town Agent The town agent has a limited role in town government with regard to civil disputes. Like the grand juror, this role is also mostly obsolete because the town hires an attorney to represent the town in legal matters. The Selectboard may ask the town agent to act as a liaison between the Selectboard and the town attorney in particular matters.

Interested candidates must be a Westford resident and a registered voter. Please contact the Town Office (878-4587 or townclerk@westfordvt.us) for more information or an application. Applications will be accepted until the positions are filled.

PLANNING COMMISSION NEWS

The Planning Commission held its second public workshop on February 19, 2014. Over 40 Westford residents attended. The workshop focused on the design and layout of residential subdivisions in the AFR II District, which is the Rt. 128 and Rt. 15 corridors. The current zoning and subdivision regulations require residential subdivisions of more than 3 lots to go through a review process called Planned Residential (Unit) Development, (PUD). This process requires, whenever feasible, that the houses be clustered close together. During the workshop, residents discussed their ideas for how this type of development could occur using some new residential design patterns the Planning Commission has been examining for possible inclusion in new "form based" zoning regulations.

As we have explained previously in this newsletter, the Planning Commission is currently engaged in the process of revising the Westford Zoning Regulations. It is working on drafting form based zoning regulations for the town center area, and for the AFR II corridors. The residents who attended the workshop were asked for their input regarding the Planning Commission's new ideas for PUDs in the AFR II District, and for their views about how residential development should occur along Rt. 128 and Rt.15. The discussions and views that were shared at the workshop have greatly assisted the Planning Commission to identify issues of importance to residents, particularly those in the AFR II District.

The Planning Commission wishes to thank everyone who has participated in this process thus far, either through one of the two workshops, or through the town's website or at the various town gatherings on the Common last summer. The Planning Commission has learned valuable information about the views of the residents. We will continue to keep you updated as we move through this process. We encourage you to participate in this process by attending our meetings. The Planning Commission will meet at the town offices at 7:00 PM on April 16th, April 30th, May 5th, and May 21st.

MOVING EARTH? YOU MAY NEED A PERMIT....

If you plan to move a large amount of earth by means of excavation or fill please contact Kate Lalley, Zoning Administrative, prior to doing so. You may need to apply for a zoning permit pursuant to Section 4.1 of the Zoning Regulations. This regulation is in place to ensure that excavation and fill does not impact the Water Resource Overlay District (streams, ponds & wetlands) and/or the Flood Hazard Overlay District. Furthermore, it ensures that proper erosion control measures are taken during land development and commercial excavation does not occur without the proper permits in place. If you have questions or would like to know whether your property is located in the Water Resource Overlay and/or Flood Hazard Overlay Districts please contact Kate Lalley, Zoning Administrative (zoning_admin@westfordvt.us) or Melissa Manka, Planning Coordinator (planner@westfordvt.us) at 878-4587 or by email.

BUILDING? YOU MAY NEED A PERMIT....

If you plan on building a *structure* you will need to first apply for a zoning permit. The permit is required to ensure the *structure* conforms to the Town Zoning Regulations (district setbacks, uses, etc). A *structure* is defined as an "Assembly of materials for occupancy or use that is a minimum of 100 square feet in size *OR* is on a permanent foundation, including but not limited to, a building; sign; wall or fence, except a wall or fence on an operating farm, or a wall or fence less than 6 feet in height." Also, please be aware that interior work such as finishing basements or attics, adding bedrooms, etc may also need a zoning permit. School Board Notes April 2014

Thank you to all voters for your participation at the Annual Meeting and Town Meeting Day. The turnout at the meeting and voting booths was very high. Although the budget article did not pass, the process has spurred high participation and started many valuable conversations around education in Westford and Vermont in general. It was encouraging to witness so many citizens sharing in the work of the board, and I hope to see that engagement continue as our focus shifts to the vote results as well as other topics.

The most common themes expressed were tax burden, spending, and the state's education funding formula. Based on feedback from the legislative community forum, an open letter to our state leadership was made available for citizens to sign. The letter voiced concern for the financial sustainability of education in Vermont, regardless of the outcome of our town's balloting. Over 240 signatures were collected. The letter was delivered to the legislators representing Westford, those serving on the Senate and House committees for Education and Finance, as well as the Secretary of Education and Governor. The board hopes to use this opportunity to bring our concerns to a larger stage and be heard. Feedback will be shared as it becomes available.

The Capital Funding article passed, which will allow for the maintenance required to our wood chip heating system. The school is one of our town's greatest capital assets—thank you for supporting its continued maintenance.

The non-binding, advisory article asking if the school be closed and students tuitioned was passed over and did not see a floor vote. Instead, another non-binding, advisory article was introduced and passed, recommending the formation of a committee to investigate how to retain a locally-controlled and sustainable school system. The board will be investigating this work and the opportunities to invite participation.

After Town Meeting:

The school board meeting following Town Meeting Day has traditionally been devoted to reorganizing the board (electing officers), executing our required governance tasks (authorizing for bill payment, setting newspaper of record, etc.), making committee assignments, and setting our meeting schedule. Without an approved budget, the board focused on the results from balloting and debated the timeline and possible options for formulating a new budget to present to the town. Several citizens were in attendance to discuss their views on next steps. Opinions were split, as evidenced by the very close vote tally. Your communication is vital—please attend meetings and/or contact any board member with your questions or concerns.

Several board members also participated in a regional meeting of the Vermont School Board Association related to the broad issues of governance currently being debated in legislature. The last great change to Vermont's education governance structure was over 100 years ago, where the state reduced the number of school districts from 3000 to 300 districts and supervisory unions. Proposals are in play which do away with supervisory unions and form a smaller number of preK-12 districts, potentially as few as 30. This reorganization has been long discussed, but appears to have enough backing and momentum to finally see action. Our board members provided thoughts and concerns about the concept. The conversation was rich and well moderated. It forced all those in attendance to reflect on our desires to both keep tradition, yet enable the highest possibility for our students to achieve.

This is a very busy time, with a great deal of potential change and challenge surrounding us. It is also a special opportunity, as I have never seen such a high level of thoughtful engagement about education. Thank you to all who are contributing to that. The board looks forward to working in the best interests of our students and citizens as we represent you.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

It's now time for Kindergarten Registration. If you have a child(ren) that will be 5 before September 1, 2014, please register them for Kindergarten by April 18, 2014.

Kindergarten Registration forms are available to be downloaded from the school website at www.ccsuvt.org/westford. Please return completed forms to the school office by April 18, 2014. Please be sure to include a copy of your child's birth certificate, immunization record and a copy of a current physical. Also 3 proofs of residency are required. Please refer to the website for a list of documents that are acceptable as proof of residency.

If your child is currently enrolled at Westford Elementary, the only form that needs to be completed is the Kindergarten Registration – Parent/Guardian Form.

If your child is currently attending another Childcare/Pre-School Program outside of Westford Elementary School but is enrolled at our school, then you will need to complete the "Kindergarten Registration – Parent/Guardian Form" only and also have the Childcare or Preschool that they are presently attending complete the "Childcare/Preschool Questionnaire".

If you know of a family with a child(ren) that will be entering Kindergarten in the fall, please encourage them to go to the website.







FROM THE WESTFORD FIRE WARDEN, DENNIS L. ANGIONO:

We are now coming to the end of a very long, cold and snowy winter. At this time I would like to thank all of you who applied for burn permits although it was not required while there was snow on the ground. In a few weeks, after the snow has melted, burn permits will once again be mandatory and will be strictly enforced. Please be aware that as ground fuels dry out and we have little rain, the danger of fire increases.

As always, I will monitor the weather on a daily basis and will open or close the burn permit system as appropriate. It is against Vermont state law to burn without a permit and to do so can result in a summons and an appearance in municipal court. For anyone new to Vermont, please be aware there is not much you can legally burn. A good rule is, if it grows on your lawn you can burn it - that means grass clippings, branches, brush and small stumps. No treated or painted wood can be burned. You cannot use accelerants to start your fire and you must have a water hose and extinguishing tools nearby. Your fire has to be completely out and not left smoldering when retiring for the evening.

You have to extinguish your fire if it becomes a nuisance to your neighbors. Please pay attention to the wind as it is an important factor in causing your burn to become out of control. If this happens please call 911. Remember, just because you can get a permit does not mean you should burn. If you have any questions about the aforementioned regulations, please call me at 879-1231 and I will be glad to address any concerns you may have pertaining to your burn. A little awareness and attention to this activity can mean the difference of summer fun and tragedy. Thank you.


