Property Taxes Due - Final Installment

The <u>final</u> property tax installment is due Thursday, May 15<sup>th</sup>. Payments postmarked (US postal, UPS, FedEx) by the 15<sup>th</sup> are considered timely as well as payments placed in the drop box <u>before</u> the office opens on Friday, May 16<sup>th</sup>. The drop box is located to the left of the town office door. Please note: any taxes received or postmarked later than the above date will be subject to 1% interest and an 8% penalty.

For your convenience, you may mail or drop off the fee and rabies certificate along with a self-addressed stamped envelope and we will mail the license to you. The fee is \$16.00 unless your dog is spayed or neutered, in which case the fee is \$13.00.

#### **SCHOOL BOARD NOTES**

There are a number of education related issues being discussed by the Legislature. None will be decided until the end of the session yet we thought it would be helpful to update you on these discussions.

Education Property Taxes: The House passed its version of this bill several weeks ago and it is now being considered in the Senate. The House version reduces the base increase in the homestead rate by 3 cents from what was recommended by the Commissioner of Taxes in December. The reduction was made possible by several factors. Proposed school budgets across the state came in lower than projected saving almost a penny. Changes to income sensitivity and the renter rebate program as well as using some one time funding were also used to achieve the 3 cent decrease. There are two other provisions of interest in the bill. The "slope" for those whose household income is over \$90,000 was extended by raising the house value on which some income sensitivity can be claimed to \$250,000. Finally, the bill asks that the legislature move to a financing system that uses a small homestead property tax rate coupled with an income rate to pay for education by 2017.

Education Governance: Three committees in the House have been working for several months on a proposal to change the governance of schools in Vermont. The focus is on larger K-12 districts in hopes that they can increase equity in the quality and variety of educational opportunities available to students. A second purpose is to increase operational efficiencies and sharing of best practices. The bill encourages districts to use the present process and incentives that are available for district realignment. The incentives remain available as long as voters approve a new district prior to 7/1/2017. For those districts that do not achieve realignment, a design team will propose new K-12 districts, will conduct public hearings before and after their preliminary proposal and will present a final proposal to the legislature by 1/1/2018. All districts would be realigned by 2020.

- -- There has been a significant change in the bill recently. It now contains provisions that preserve school choice for those districts that currently do not operate schools. This means that a community like Westford would either retain its own school board or be realigned with other districts that offer high school choice. One possibility would be that Essex Town, Essex Junction, and Essex High School would become one district, Westford would remain a district and the two districts would share a superintendent and a supervisory union board.
- -- The Senate is working on an entirely different proposal that would reduce the number of supervisory unions and thus the number of superintendents would retain all the present school districts and boards, and would redefine the roles of principals and superintendents.
- -- It isn't clear at this time whether any change in governance will become law this year. The discussion has raised many issues about how to best govern schools to create better outcomes and opportunities for students and to operate as efficiently as possible.
- -- A lot of information can be found on the legislative website including very interesting information from public hearings on the topic. If the subject interests you, please go to the legislative website (<a href="www.leg.state.vt.us">www.leg.state.vt.us</a>) and look for the Standing Committee Web Pages. If you click on the name of the committee (not the blue icon) you can read the materials that have been submitted. In this case you would want to look at the pages for both House Education and House Ways and Means. The House bill number is H.883.

Moratorium on Privatization of a Public School: The Senate passed a bill that would impose a two year moratorium on converting a public school into a private school as was done in North Bennington. When the bill came up for action in the House, some parliamentary maneuvers led to a motion to order the bill to lie. It is unlikely to come up again in the House but the Senate could attach it to a different bill. The bill, S.91, was passed by the Senate in response to the privatization of the public school in North Bennington. Many legislators have questions about using public money to fund schools that don't operate under the same rules and regulations as public schools particularly with regard to admission, special education, and opportunities like Free and Reduced Lunch programs.

Our board will continue to monitor the progress of these bills in the legislature. Our next meeting will be held on May 5<sup>th</sup>. #### THINGS EVERY PROPERTY OWNER SHOULD KNOW ABOUT...

## THE WATER RESOURCE OVERLAY DISTRICT & FLOOD HAZARD OVERLAY DISTRICT

The Town of Westford has a Water Resource Overlay District and Flood Hazard Overlay District. The purpose of these districts is to protect water quality, public health, safety and welfare. Please note that these districts could affect the use of your property. ALL property owners should be aware of the district(s) location as well as the uses and restrictions in the district(s).

Please review Map 5 (Water Resources, Wetlands & Floodplains) of the Town Plan to determine whether your property contains locally regulated water resources or floodplains. It is important to note that the Water Resource Overlay boundaries are determined by the Town using the best available data and the Flood Hazard Overlay boundaries are determined by the State and Federal governments. It is also important to note that 2009 brought about changes to both these boundaries. Town Plan Maps can be viewed on the Town website www.westfordvt.us or at the Town Office.

Once you have determined whether your property is located in the Water Resource Overlay and/or Flood Hazard Overlay, you should familiarize yourself with the regulations associated with these districts. Below is a *summary* of the regulations for each district. A complete copy of the regulations can be reviewed on the Town website at *www.westfordvt.us* or at the Town Office. We highly recommend you review the regulations in their entity if you own property in either of these districts.

#### Water Resource Overlay District Regulations Summary:

#### Permitted Uses:

- Low impact forms of recreation
- Snowmobiling
- Agricultural operations conducted in accordance with the VT Accepted Agricultural Practices
- Logging conducted in accordance with the VT Acceptable Management Practices for Maintaining Water
   Quality
- Maintenance of existing lawn or open land
- Use and maintenance of man-made ponds
- Reforestation projects
- Control of non-native species
- Wastewater systems and potable water systems permitted by the State of VT

#### Conditional Uses:

- Construction of man-made ponds
- Construction of public facilities, infrastructure& services
- Construction of boardwalks
- Construction or expansion of private driveways, private roads or private bridges

- Construction of public or private trails greater than 4 ft in width
- Seasonal use, non-permanent arrangements such as docks, gazebos, etc.

#### Prohibited Uses:

- Cutting vegetation, such as trees or shrubs, except for logging operations in accordance with VT Acceptable Management Practices for Maintaining Water Quality
- Manipulation of water or shoreline such as excavating, dredging, draining and filling
- Construction of permanent structures
- Installation of underground power and communication lines, unless located under a DRB approved roadway
- Storage of hazardous materials

Please note: State and/or Federal permits may be required in addition to Town permits if disturbing, developing in or developing near a water resource.

#### Flood Hazard Overlay District Summary:

Ultimately, the Flood Hazard Overlay District is a no build and no fill zone.

However, new accessory structures (which meet flood hazard definition of an accessory structure), roadways and substantial improvements of existing structures are allowed with conditional use approval.

**Note:** The Town of Westford does not delineate boundaries or locations of Class two wetlands. Therefore, individuals should contact the State of Vermont Department of Environmental Protection with wetland concerns and questions.

## MOVING EARTH? YOU MAY NEED A PERMIT....

If you plan to move a large amount of earth by means of excavation or fill please contact Kate Lalley, Zoning Administrative, prior to doing so. You may need to apply for a zoning permit pursuant to Section 4.1 of the Zoning Regulations. This regulation is in place to ensure that excavation and fill does not impact the Water Resource Overlay District (streams, ponds & wetlands) and/or the Flood Hazard Overlay District. Furthermore, it ensures that proper erosion control measures are taken during land development and commercial excavation does not occur without the proper permits in place. ### BUILDING? YOU MAY NEED A PERMIT....

If you plan on building a *structure* you will need to first apply for a zoning permit. The permit is required to ensure the *structure* conforms to the Town Zoning Regulations (district setbacks, uses, etc). A *structure* is defined as an "Assembly of materials for occupancy or use that is a minimum of 100 square feet in size *OR* is on a permanent foundation, including but not limited to, a building; sign; wall or fence, except a wall or fence on an operating farm, or a wall or fence less than 6 feet in height." Also, please be aware that interior work such as finishing basements or attics, adding bedrooms, etc. may also need a zoning permit. #### CARING FOR YOUR SEPTIC SYSTEM

Septic systems are very much like automobiles. They need periodic inspections and proper maintenance to continue working properly. Also, like automobiles, they must be operated properly and cannot be overtaxed without the owner suffering consequences such as repair or replacement bills.

#### WHAT TO DO

- HAVE YOUR SEPTIC TANK PUMPED very 2 to 5 years by a septage hauler. At the same time, the tank should be inspected for leaks or damage to baffles and pipes. Any leaks or damage should be repaired immediately. This is not a do-it-yourself job. You should, however, check the level of sewage scum and sludge in the tank yearly.
- Each spring, after the frost is out of the ground, check your leachfield for wet spots. You should also INSPECT THE DISTRIBUTION BOX (AND PUMP OR SIPHON CHAMBER if you have one) to make sure they are level. If these components are not level, the leachfield will not receive even distribution and the siphon or pump may not function properly. It may be necessary to call a designer or installer to reset and repair these components or any shifted or broken piping going in or out of them.
- Several times each year (set up a regular schedule) INSPECT THE SIPHON OR PUMP if your system has one. Observe the operation of at least one cycle. Run water in the house until the chamber is filled and the siphon or pump activates. If the chamber does not fill or does not empty and fill to the specified levels, then servicing is required.

#### WHAT NOT TO DO

An absorption field generally does not require any maintenance. However, to protect and prolong the life of the absorption field, follow these simple rules:

- Plant only grass over and near your septic system. Roots from nearby trees or shrubs may clog and damage the absorption field.
- Do not drive or park over any part of your septic system. This can compact the soil and crush your system.
- Direct all wastewater from your home into the septic tank. This includes all sink, bath, shower, toilet, washing machine, and dishwasher wastewaters. Any of these wastewaters can contain disease-causing microorganisms or environmental pollutants.
- Keep roof drains, basement sump pump drains, and other rainwater or surface water drainage systems away from the absorption field. Flooding of the absorption field with excessive water will keep the soil from naturally cleansing the wastewater, which can lead to groundwater and/or nearby surface pollution.

#### SEPTIC SYSTEM HEALTH TIPS

- Conserve water to avoid overloading the septic system. Be sure to repair any leaky faucets or toilets. Use low-flow fixtures.
- Do not use caustic drain openers for a clogged drain. Instead, use boiling water or a drain snake to open clogs.
- Do not use septic tank additives, commercial septic tank cleansers, yeast, sugar, etc. These products are not necessary and some may be harmful to your system.
- Use commercial bathroom cleansers and laundry detergents in moderation. Many people prefer to clean their toilets, sinks, showers, and tubs with mild detergent or baking soda.
- Your septic system is not a trash can. Do not put disposable diapers, sanitary napkins, tampons, paper towels, facial tissues, plastics, cat litter, or cigarettes into your septic system. These items quickly fill your septic tank with solids, decrease the efficiency, and will require that you pump out the septic tank more frequently. They may also clog the sewer line to the septic system causing wastewater to back up into your home.
- Avoid dumping grease or fats down your kitchen drain. They solidify and the accumulation may contribute to blockages in your system.
- Keep latex paint, varnishes, thinners, waste oil, photographic solutions, pesticides, or other hazardous chemicals out
  of your system. Even in small amounts, these items can destroy the biological digestion taking place within your
  septic system.


