Time Table to Town Meeting

- **February 25th (Wednesday)** – 5:00 p.m. deadline to submit an application for addition to the checklist, or to file a written notice of intent to apply for those who are not eligible to register to vote but will be by Town Meeting.
- **March 2nd (Monday)** – Town Meeting and public hearing for Australian ballot questions (including town and school budgets), 7:00 p.m., at the Westford School in the gym.
- **March 3rd (Tuesday)** – Voting day for Australian ballot articles. Polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. in the Westford School gym.

Dog Licenses

Dog Licenses are due by April 1st. A current rabies certificate is required. If you are unsure if the current certificate is on file, please call the Town Office. For your convenience, you may mail or drop off the fee and rabies certificate along with a self-addressed stamped envelope and your license will be mailed to you. The fee until April 1st is \$10.00 for spayed or neutered dogs and \$12.00 for dogs that are not spayed or neutered. Dog licenses obtained **after April 1st are subject to a late fee.** We encourage all dog owners to register their dogs before April 1st.

Winter Reminders

- Plowing snow from your driveway across town roads is prohibited. This could cause damage to the town road equipment and also poses a hazard to vehicles traveling on the road.
- Please do not park vehicles on the road. This makes it very difficult for the road crew to plow and sand. Vehicles parked on the road may be towed at the owner's expense.
- Snowmobile travel on roads is prohibited unless the Selectboard has granted permission for a specific area.

Delinquent Tax Collector For the Town of Westford, VT

Duties include: contacting taxpayers, arranging for payments and/or taking formal collection actions, including tax sales when necessary. Recording, reporting and delivering delinquent tax payments, to the Town Treasurer. Providing an annual accounting to the auditors and for inclusion in the Town Report.

The successful applicant must be organized, able to work independently and meet goals and deadlines. Must be able to work creatively with people to achieve goal of timely payments. Driver's license required. Compensation: 8% of collected taxes, approximately \$4,500-\$6,000 annually. Part time, flexible, may include some evening & weekend hours.

Ratios-How Does Westford Measure Up?

A lot is being written these days about the high cost of education in Vermont and how staffing of schools contributes to that cost. The board has been looking at how Westford compares to statewide averages in this regard. The following chart tells the story.

Student/staffing metrics	Vermont State average	Westford School FY'15 (actual)	Westford School FY'16 (proposed)	FY'15 Delta vs. state average
Average class size (K-8)	13	19.9	18.4 (projected)	+53%
Student to teacher ratio*	9.9	12.1	12.2 (projected)	+22%
Student to staff ratio**	4.67	5.59	5.54 (projected)	+20%

Class size numbers indicate the average number of students in a regular classroom. As you can see, Westford is 53% above the statewide average. Each year the administration and the school board use our Class Size Guidelines policy to determine the number of teachers needed for each grade. This has allowed us to reduce teachers as enrollment has declined.

The student to teacher ratio measures the ratio of students to all certified teachers. (This includes teachers beyond classroom teachers such as guidance counselor, nurse, librarian, PE, art, music and so on.) Again the chart shows that Westford is above the statewide average.

The final metric that is often cited is a student to all staff ratio. The term staff refers to all employees of the school including those such as aides and custodians. Again you can see that Westford is above the statewide average.

To help one understand how important these ratios are, consider this fact published by the Vermont Agency of Education. If the statewide Student to Staff ratio were increased from its present average of 4.67 to 5.0, the state would save \$75M. This would translate into a greater than 7 cent reduction in the state base property tax rate.

Your Westford School Board and administration continue to look carefully each year at the appropriate staffing level for our elementary school. As the statewide conversation continues, we thought it would be helpful for you to understand how Westford “measures up”.

It's all in the Plan!

Thank you to all Westford citizens and board members who participated in the review of our draft 2015 Town Plan. Your valued input is helping to create a unified vision for our Town's future and its goals.

The Planning Commission presented the draft for the 2015 Westford Town Plan on January 21st at the Red Brick Meeting House. The public hearing was well attended and included members of the Conservation Commission and Selectboard.

Chairperson Jeremy Berger conducted the presentation supported by 2 projectors, enabling participants to clearly view Town Plan objectives and maps simultaneously for easy reference during the presentation. Public discussion ranged from individual landowners' concerns to public infrastructure projects. In general, the Plan was well received with several constructive comments raised by community and board members.

Contribution hi-lights included:

- Creating a top ten priorities list in the Town Plan Implementation Section.
- Establishing a timeline for implementing the proposed forestry district and conducting a natural resource inventory.
- Listing riparian buffers as important wildlife corridors.
- Noting the Town should research group net metering for municipal buildings
- Reverting census tables into easy-to-read charts.
- Revising draft Town Plan Map 10 *Contiguous Forest & Wildlife Movement* for clear interpretation.

After appropriate changes to the working draft, the Planning Commission will next present it to the Selectboard for review. When a final draft is complete the Selectboard will host a second public hearing for further comments.

TOWN OF WESTFORD - WINTER ROAD POLICY

The Westford Highway Department has the responsibility of maintaining 39.4 miles of town roads, of which 36.9 miles are gravel and 2.5 miles are paved. This policy is based on the goal of obtaining safe highway travel surfaces during winter months. It is our goal to achieve this at the earliest practical time and in the most cost efficient manner during and after a storm event. Providing bare, dry travel surfaces during a winter storm event is not practical and therefore not expected.

Each winter storm event is unique. It is impractical to develop specific rules on winter maintenance operations. Therefore, the judgment of the Road Foreman often governs the quantities and type of applications used to control snow and ice.

Snow Plowing

The Town of Westford begins plowing when snow has accumulated 2 to 3 inches. Plowing may begin as early as 4:00 a.m. and stops when the storm has ended or 10:00 p.m., whichever comes sooner.

Sand

Sand will be applied to all gravel roads. With the use of sand in winter maintenance material, some particles may be as large as ¾" in size and may cause windshield damage. Travelers should use caution and avoid following other vehicles or town trucks too closely. The Town will not pay for any vehicle repairs, such as the replacement of windshields. When ice is present under the sand, instant stops are impossible.

Plow Routes

Each plow route takes approximately 4 hours to complete, sometimes longer depending on the storm. This means if plowing started when there was 2 inches of snow on the road, by the time the truck finishes the route there is the potential for up to 6 inches or more of snow on the road again. Therefore, during a heavy snowstorm, at times there will be snow on the roads. There shall be no riders in the town trucks other than the operator of the truck and authorized town officials. All town trucks shall be pulled to the side of the road when the operator is using a cell phone.

Freezing Rain

It is important to note that salt or sand is less effective if applied before the rain stops. There is little the Westford Highway Department can do during a freezing rainstorm. Salt and sand will be applied to the roads sparingly during the event and more aggressively as needed once the storm is over.

Bare Roads

The Town of Westford does not have a bare road policy. Travelers who use Town roads should exercise due care and reasonable caution while driving during the winter months.

Mailboxes

The Town will not repair or replace mailboxes damaged by snow or ice clearing operations. Heavy snow coming off the plow blade will often knock over and damage mailboxes/posts that have not been adequately mounted and maintained or braced, or those mailboxes with doors left open. Also mailboxes/posts may be damaged by private contractors or homeowners during driveway clearing operations.

Trash Placement

Trash and trash receptacles should be placed in a manner that will not interfere with winter road maintenance. The Town will not be responsible for damage to trash receptacles or trash clean up as a result of its obstruction of snow removal.

Parked Vehicles

No vehicle shall be parked on the Town's right-of-way from the start of precipitation until 48 hours after the storm ends. The Town reserves the right to tow parked vehicles at the owner's expense. The Town is not liable for damages incurred to vehicles parked in the Town's right-of-way.

Plowing Across Town Roads

The practice of plowing snow from driveways across Town roads is prohibited. Residual snow creates a dangerous obstruction (piles, ridges, etc.). Snow shoveling into the roadway will cause similar problems. Once frozen, the piles/ridges can cause vehicles to lose control and can also cause damage to vehicles and town trucks and equipment. Generally, the Town will warn the responsible resident for a first occurrence. Subsequent violations may result in further action, which may include but is not limited to fines.
