Town Office Notes

Dogs

Dog licenses were due April 1st. If you have not licensed your dog(s) please do so before June 8th to avoid additional fees that may be assessed. Per State Statute a list of dogs that remain unlicensed as of June 8th will be turned over to the Selectboard.

A current rabies certificate is required. If you are unsure if the current certificate is on file, please call the Town Office. For your convenience, you may mail or drop off the fee and rabies certificate along with a self-addressed stamped envelope and we will mail the license to you. The fee is \$17.00 unless your dog is spayed or neutered, in which case the fee is \$14.00.

Friendly Reminders

- Burn permits are required prior to any burning. Burn permits are available from the Fire Warden (Dennis Angiono, 879-1231), online at <https://westfordvt.us/administration/fire-warden/> or from the Town Office.
- Yard waste (leaves, brush, etc.) are not considered household garbage, therefore Myers will not collect these materials. Yard waste can be composted or brought to a participating CSWD drop off center.
- **Metal items** can be put in the metal dumpster located at the town garage.
- **Hazardous waste materials** must be brought to a participating CSWD drop off center. **The Rover** will be accepting household hazardous waste in Westford **Saturday, July 8th, 9am-1pm** at the Town Garage. This is a free service sponsored by the Chittenden Solid Waste District.

CHANGE TO WEEKLY RECYCLE PICK UP

The Selectboard is pleased to announce that Myer's will begin collecting recyclables weekly from all households effective immediately. Myer's conducted a pilot study and determined that it's more efficient to collect recyclables weekly from each household rather than every two weeks. They are hopeful the weekly collection will encourage residents to recycle even more therefore reducing the amount of trash being picked up. Myer's has agreed to honor the current contract price with this change.

Myers has asked that we remind people of recycling standards. Recycling material requirements are a minimum of 2 inches x 2 inches and a maximum of 2 feet x 2 feet. This is because the facility is designed to handle recyclables of standard shapes and sizes. Science @ Westford School

The Westford Robotics Team, self-named the Periodic Pandas, has been recognized for innovation and bestowed a prestigious Global Innovation Award from the First Lego League. The Periodic Pandas have been selected as one of 20 teams with entries from 30 countries for their outstanding project innovative solution, BeeFinder.org, that demonstrated originality while having the potential to add significant value in the world. The team will travel to Washington, DC USA from June 18-20 to present their innovation to expert judges.

They will participate in a two day, hands-on innovation event at the Kellogg Conference Center in Washington, DC, which culminates in the awarding of the **top prize of \$20,000** USD to continue work on their inventions; two runners-up will take home \$5,000 each.

The team, composed of 12 members in grades 3 through 8, chose to focus their project work on creating a location aware software solution to identify and develop native bee habitat. Their solution uses open data (satellite imagery, GIS maps, etc.) to identify the necessary habitat conditions to promote thriving native bee populations, and make that data actionable for homeowners all the way up to regional or national policy makers. The team's goal is to reverse the trend of declining pollinator population and its impact on our global food supply.

The Westford Science Fair celebrated its sixth anniversary this year with a majority of students participating. The science fair serves as an exciting, culminating event for students and highlights their interests and creativity. Additionally, this year we included

This time of year we are engaged various assessments including the NECAP science assessment and the SBAC assessment of literacy and mathematics. The use of data to make informed decisions on what each student needs is a strong commitment and Spring data also informs how we begin the 2017/18 school year including the allocation of resources.
