Town Office Notes

Property Tax Installment

The third property tax installment is due Wednesday, March 15th. Payments will be considered timely if they are received by this date, have a March 15th postmark (postal, FedEX and UPS), or are in the drop box located to the left of the Town Office door before the office opens at 8:30 a.m. on Thursday, March 16th.

Please note - If you pay your taxes using Bill Pay (generating a check online through your financial institution), please make sure you allow sufficient time for mailing. These envelopes do not bear a postmark therefore will be acknowledged by the date <u>received</u> at the Town Office <u>not</u> by the date on the check.

PLANNING COMMISSION NEWS

The Planning Commission is in need of your assistance. We are asking you to complete a survey, the link to which is at the end of this article. The reason we need your assistance is as follows:

In 2016, the Vermont Legislature passed Act 174 which established a new set of municipal and regional energy planning standards. If a municipality meets these new standards, its Town Plan and zoning regulations will carry greater "weight" in the Public Service Board siting process for commercial energy generation facilities. By offering municipalities the opportunity to have a greater say in the siting of commercial energy generating facilities, Act 174 encourages all municipalities to incorporate energy planning into their local Town Plans. Act 174 addresses large energy generation facilities such as commercial solar, wind and biomass. It does not specifically address smaller, point of use type energy generation, such rooftop solar.

The siting of commercial generating facilities will become a significant issue in the near future because the Vermont Department of Public Service has established the goals of: 1) obtaining 90% of the State's energy from renewable sources by 2050 and 2) reducing the State's energy consumption by more than 1/3 by 2050. In order to accomplish these goals, there will need to be a large increase in the number of commercial energy generating facilities throughout Vermont.

Act 174's primary purpose is to identify sites where large energy generating facilities might be located. However, the Act also encourages municipalities to survey how much and what types of energy the residents of the municipality use. The majority of Vermont's energy use is devoted to heat and transportation, not electrical use. While the energy plan Westford eventually creates will have to consider siting criteria for commercial energy generation facilities, it should also address current and future heat and transportation needs within the Town.

The Planning Commission has revived the Energy Committee in order to provide assistance to the Planning Commission in the re-writing of the Town's Energy Plan. The Planning Commission, in cooperation with the Energy Committee, has prepared a survey seeking information about the energy usage by Westford residents. We hope the responses will give us a good understanding of current energy use in the Town. Unlike other surveys, this one is not designed to be answered by each resident. **Rather, we are seeking only one submission per household. The survey will end on March 31, 2017.**

ESSEX WESTFORD SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD NOTES

The School Board of the Essex Westford Educational Community Unified Union School District (EWSD) approved a Fiscal Year 2018 budget proposal of \$75.2 million at its February 21st meeting. This is the first consolidated budget for the new unified district and will allow nearly 4,000 students to enjoy seamless continuity in the district's highly regarded educational programs, while improving student equity and expanding access. Tax rates in all three municipalities are projected to decrease as a result of the tax incentives built into Act 46.

The budget planning process was a major effort lasting for months. After controlling for the complexities involved in the financial structures of the Chittenden Central Supervisory Union, its three constituent districts, and the Essex Town School District, the combined budgets for FY17 came to \$73,513,807. The FY18 budget of \$75,287,014 represents a 2.41% increase from the FY17 budgets of the districts, and can be expressed as an expenditure of \$15,961.19 per equalized pupil. The Board plans to provide community members with specific budget details ahead of the Annual Meeting to show where savings have occurred as a result of unification, and where the Board has approved one-time expenditures that are best made during the five-year, graduated tax incentive period.

Voters at the Annual Meeting of the Unified Union School District will be asked to approve the budget as well as three additional articles. One establishes a capital reserve to fund major projects such as school roof replacements. The next article asks voters to approve appropriating \$1.209 million to the capital reserve fund. Doing so brings the per pupil spending to \$16,284.12. After applying the 10-cent Act 46 incentive and using the published yields, passing both the budget and the capital plan would result in a projected district-wide Homestead Tax Rate of \$1.516. This rate is then adjusted by each town's Common Level of Appraisal (CLA), with the result that taxpayers in Westford would see a projected tax rate of \$1.508, a 2.7-cent decrease from the current year. Those in Essex Town would have a projected tax rate of \$1.556, a 1.1-cent decrease from current year, while Essex Junction taxpayers' projected rate is \$1.555, or 3 cents less than in the current year. The projected rate for those who pay some or all of their education taxes based on their household income is 2.57%, down from 2.81% in Essex Junction and 2.77% in Essex Town and Westford. The final article asks voters to approve a budget of \$8,238,762 for the Center for Technology, Essex. This budget has no direct effect on local taxes, since the CTE budget is paid for by tuition from feeder districts. (Note: tax rates are projections only and the final numbers will not be determined until the legislature sets the final yield rates.)

Residents of Essex Junction, Essex Town and Westford will have the opportunity to learn more about the budget at an informational meeting to be held at Essex High School on Tuesday, April 4th, at 6:30 p.m. The Annual Meeting will occur at the high school on Monday, April 10th, at 7:00 p.m., with voting by Australian ballot on the budget to occur on Tuesday, April 11th, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. at polling places in the three municipalities. Andre and Martha will hold an informational meeting in Westford prior to the 4/11 vote. Watch the Front Porch Forum for details.

Two items will be of particular interest to Westford residents. The budget will pay for transportation of Westford's high school students to and from school. Also, the capital budget plan reflects the intention to deal with Westford's driveway issues in FY19.

Selling or refinancing? Zoning FAQs

If you plan to sell or refinance your property be aware that most banks, title attorneys and mortgage brokers now require borrowers to verify their property is in zoning compliance. Discovering your property is not compliant can be an unpleasant (and sometimes costly) surprise and can impact the timing of your property closing.

Before you refinance or sell please check on your zoning status with Westford Zoning Administrator Kate Lalley. She can help you resolve any outstanding zoning requirements that may exist before you close. You can reach Kate at zoning admin@westfordvt.us or 878-4587.

Getting into zoning compliance can take time! Depending on the situation, it can take 30 days or longer to achieve zoning compliance. Only afterwards can the ZA certify the full zoning compliance most purchasers and lenders now expect. Plan ahead!




