FY'19 Town Budget Workshops & Informational Meeting

The Selectboard began working on the FY'19 town budget in October. Upcoming workshops will be held on December 21st and December 28th. An informational meeting will be held **Thursday, January 11th at 7pm** at the Town Office to present the draft town budget. The workshops and information meeting are excellent opportunities for residents to provide feedback prior to finalization of the budget and before being voted on in March 2018.

Petition Deadlines

Petitions for articles to be considered for inclusion in the warning for Town Meeting are due by 5:00 p.m. Thursday, January 18th. Please make sure your name is as it appears on the voter checklist and to fill in the office you are running for (including length of term) before circulating your petition. Petitions must be signed by at least 5% of the registered voters (a minimum of 80). Please be sure that the person signing the petition is a registered voter and that their name is legible.

Petitions for elected offices (e.g. Selectboard, etc.) can be picked up at the Town Office and must be submitted no later than 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 29th. Petitions must be signed by a minimum of 16 registered voters. Please contact the Town Office for a complete list of offices with terms expiring in March 2018.

- **January 18th (Thursday)** – 5pm deadline to file petitions with the Town Clerk for Town Meeting articles

- **March 5th (Monday)** – 5pm deadline to request an absentee ballot
- **March 5th (Monday)** – 7pm Town Meeting (floor votes) and public hearing for Australian ballot questions (including town budget), at the Westford School in the gym
- **March 6th (Tuesday)** – Voting day by Australian ballot. Polls will be open from 7am - 7pm in the Westford School gym

TOWN OF WESTFORD - WINTER ROAD POLICY

Adopted by the Selectboard on December 13, 2012

The Westford Highway Department has the responsibility of maintaining 39.4 miles of town roads, of which 36.9 miles are gravel and 2.5 miles are paved. This policy is based on the goal of obtaining safe highway travel surfaces during winter months. It is our goal to achieve this at the earliest practical time and in the most cost efficient manner during and after a storm event. Providing bare, dry travel surfaces during a winter storm event is not practical and therefore not expected.

Each winter storm event is unique. It is impractical to develop specific rules on winter maintenance operations. Therefore, the judgment of the Road Foreman often governs the quantities and type of applications used to control snow and ice.

Snow Plowing

The Town of Westford begins plowing when snow has accumulated 2 to 3 inches. Plowing may begin as early as 4:00 a.m. and stops when the storm has ended or 10:00 p.m., whichever comes sooner.

Sand

Sand will be applied to all gravel roads. With the use of sand in winter maintenance material, some particles may be as large as ¾" in size and may cause windshield damage. Travelers should use caution and avoid following other vehicles or town trucks too closely. The Town will not pay for any vehicle repairs, such as the replacement of windshields. When ice is present under the sand, instant stops are impossible.

Plow Routes

Each plow route takes approximately 4 hours to complete, sometimes longer depending on the storm. This means if plowing started when there was 2 inches of snow on the road, by the time the truck finishes the route there is the potential for up to 6 inches or more of snow on the road again. Therefore, during a heavy snowstorm, at times there will be snow on the roads. There shall be no riders in the town trucks other than the operator of the truck and authorized town officials. All town trucks shall be pulled to the side of the road when the operator is using a cell phone.

Freezing Rain

It is important to note that salt or sand is less effective if applied before the rain stops. There is little the Westford Highway Department can do during a freezing rainstorm. Salt and sand will be applied to the roads sparingly during the event and more aggressively as needed once the storm is over.

Bare Roads

The Town of Westford does not have a bare road policy. Travelers who use Town roads should exercise due care and reasonable caution while driving during the winter months.

Mailboxes

The Town will not repair or replace mailboxes damaged by snow or ice clearing operations. Heavy snow coming off the plow blade will often knock over and damage mailboxes/posts that have not been adequately mounted and maintained or braced, or those mailboxes with doors left open. Also mailboxes/posts may be damaged by private contractors or homeowners during driveway clearing operations.

Trash Placement

Trash and trash receptacles should be placed in a manner that will not interfere with winter road maintenance. The Town will not be responsible for damage to trash receptacles or trash clean up as a result of its obstruction of snow removal.

Parked Vehicles

No vehicle shall be parked on the Town's right-of-way from the start of precipitation until 48 hours after the storm ends. The Town reserves the right to tow parked vehicles at the owner's expense. The Town is not liable for damages incurred to vehicles parked in the Town's right-of-way.

Plowing Across Town Roads

The practice of plowing snow from driveways across Town roads is prohibited. Residual snow creates a dangerous obstruction (piles, ridges, etc.). Snow shoveling into the roadway will cause similar problems. Once frozen, the piles/ridges can cause vehicles to lose control and can also cause damage to vehicles and town trucks and equipment. Generally, the Town will warn the responsible resident for a first occurrence. Subsequent violations may result in further action, which may include but is not limited to fines.

WINTER ROADS & NEW ROAD CREW MEMBERS

Now that winter has settled in, the Town of Westford would like to remind residents of its Winter Road Policy. The policy can be found in this newsletter and on the Town's website at <https://westfordvt.us/wp-content/uploads/2014/09/Winter-Road-Policy.pdf>.

Please note - the Town has two new road crew members. John Roberts served as interim Road Foreman from September until his hire in November. Sean Cushing was also hired in November. This is their first winter plowing Westford roads. The Town appreciates your patience as John and Sean become accustomed with winter maintenance of our town roads.

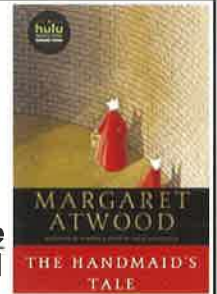

The Handmaid's Tale is a dystopian novel originally published in 1985. Set in a near-future New England, a totalitarian government has overthrown the United States.

Offred is a Handmaid in the Republic of Gilead. She may leave the home of the Commander and his wife once a day to walk to food markets whose signs are now pictures instead of words because women are no longer allowed to read. She must lie on her back once a month and pray that the Commander makes her pregnant, because in an age of declining births, Offred and the other Handmaids are valued only if their ovaries are viable.

Offred can remember the days before, when she lived and made love with her husband Luke; when she played with and protected her daughter; when she had a job, money of her own, and access to knowledge. But all of that is gone now....

WESTFORD SCHOOL NEWS

Budget Development

Westford School is entering a budget process as part of a unified school district. The EWSD School Board will be working on the FY19 budget beginning in January. Presently, administration is reviewing enrollment data and staffing ratios, as well as projecting costs for the next school year. The focus of this year's budget development are the district-wide priorities as a new K-12 continuum, identifying the investments necessary to improve equity and align student outcomes, as well as the specific building needs to deliver quality programming. The financial projections at a statewide level look to be very challenging. All the budget work sessions in January and February are open to the public and materials will be posted on the EWSD website following each meeting.

Communications Update

In a collaborative effort with PTO officers, Westford School plans to publish a quick Westford School 411 reference guide outlining the variety of methods used for school-home communication. Look for this guide and more details in late January via the school webpage and parent email.

In order to best understand the before school or after school childcare needs of families, I'm asking families to identify their needs via a survey. This is an opportunity to connect with the principal and to extend options for families beyond monthly night time PTO meetings, social media, and other forms of written communication. It is an informal meeting time to celebrate school successes and learn more about featured programs and events. The next Tea with the Principal is January 18 and will feature the various methods of school-home communication.

Featured Programs & Activities

Middle School Offerings

This year the middle school master schedule was redesigned to reflect a variety of options aimed at increasing student choice and providing flexibility in meeting student needs. Some choices reflect a year-long commitment while others allow for students to make different choices mid year. We are asking students to talk with their parents and trusted adults to review the options and discuss what makes sense for each individual student. This is a great time to identify top priorities and to discuss the reasoning behind preferences. It is important that students have a balance in their day that provides opportunity for challenge as well as time in their comfort zone. Choices such as instrumental lessons, band, chorus, French, advanced studio art, Jakku Rey's droid engineering workshop, book club, unified sports, and community media are designed to engage students beyond our required classes.

Curriculum & Instruction

When students return from the December break, we enter our winter assessment window. This mid-year check provides us with information concerning student progress in literacy and math. It allows us to adjust both individual student plans and school-wide action steps.

Professional Development

Building from our district wide curriculum work, middle school teachers will continue to explore various tools for reporting out on Personal Learning Plans. We anticipate adopting a district-wide tool for implementation in 2018/19. Our experience using both Naviance and Google will be helpful in this process.

ExxonMobil Educational Alliance Program Grant

All of us at the Westford Elementary School are very grateful for a \$500 grant from the ExxonMobil Educational Alliance Program to support the school's math and science programs. We would like to thank Jolley Associates and the Midtown Jolley in Milton for securing the grant for Westford School. In the past, the grant has been used to purchase STEM Science equipment, including, last year, digital scales for grades 5 - 8, pictured here being used in buoyancy experiments. The students and staff of Westford School greatly appreciate the continued support of Jolley Associates, and ExxonMobil.

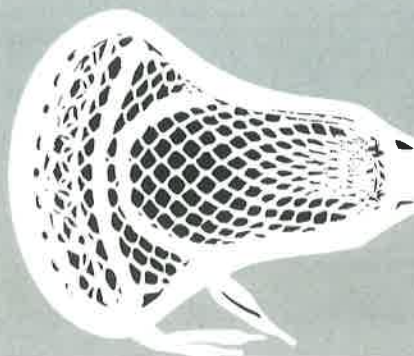
