Town Office Notes

Dog Licenses

Dog licenses were due April 1st. If you have not licensed your dog(s) please do so before June 13th to avoid additional fees that may be assessed. Per State Statute a list of dogs that remain unlicensed as of June 13th will be turned over to the Selectboard.

A current rabies certificate is required. If you are unsure if the current certificate is on file, please call the Town Office. For your convenience, you may mail or drop off the fee and rabies certificate along with a self-addressed stamped envelope and we will mail the license to you. The fee is \$17.00 unless your dog is spayed or neutered, in which case the fee is \$14.00.

Friendly Reminders

- Burn permits are required prior to any burning. Burn permits are available from the Fire Warden (Dennis Angiono, 879-1231), online at https://westfordvt.us/administration/fire-warden/ or from the Town Office. Permits must be obtained on the day you want to burn and are for that day only.
- Yard waste (leaves, brush, etc.) are not considered household garbage, therefore Myers will <u>not</u> collect these materials. Yard waste can be composted or brought to a participating CSWD drop off center.
- Metal items can be put in the metal dumpster located at the town garage.
- Hazardous waste materials must be brought to a participating CSWD drop off center. The Rover will be accepting household hazardous waste in Westford Saturday, July 13th, 9am-1pm at the Town Garage. This is a free service sponsored by the Chittenden Solid Waste District.

WESTFORD CONSERVATION COMMISSION

In May, approximately 20 volunteers helped the Winooski Natural Resources Conservation District (WNRCD) successfully plant 670 trees along Morgan Brook in Westford. These trees will help reduce sediment and phosphorus runoff for water quality, protect stream banks from future erosion, increase shade and cool the waters for trout, and expand habitat for rare species like the wood turtle. "It's a great program," says WNRCD District Manager Gianna Petito, "we provide the technical assistance, order the trees, coordinate the volunteers and pay for almost all the costs, we just need interested and passionate landowners to give the trees a home."

WNRCD will be doing more plantings in the Westford area next spring 2020 so if you live along a stream that needs some trees, contact them to schedule a site visit this summer (<u>info@winooskinrcd.org</u>). Thank you to all who helped!

Chittenden County Regional Planning Commissioner Representative & Alternate Representative

The Chittenden County Regional Planning Commission was founded in 1966 to promote the mutual cooperation of its 19 member municipalities and to facilitate the appropriate development and preservation of the physical and human resources in Chittenden County.

CCRPC is composed of 19 municipal commissioners and five at-large commissioners (representing Agriculture, Conservation/Environment, Socio-Economic/Housing, and Transportation). The legislative body of each of Chittenden County's municipalities selects its own commissioner and alternate commissioner. The Full Commission selects the five at-large representatives. Each commissioner has one vote.

CCRPC's regular monthly meeting is on the third Wednesday of the month at 6:00pm in the Main Conference Room. These meetings are open to the public.







TOWN COMMON USE POLICY

- 1. There is no exclusive use of the common. When scheduling an event, please be aware that this is public property which is used by the general public.
- 2. Clean up after your dog.
- 3. Large gatherings need to be scheduled with the Town Office to avoid conflicts.
- 4. All events must be over by dark, with the exception of Town sanctioned events.
- 5. Noise should be kept at a level so as not to infringe on the rights of neighboring residents.
- 6. All trash and recycling must be picked up and placed in the proper receptacles.
- 7. Tables and chairs must be returned to the gazebo.
- 8. Exercise care around the flower beds and plantings.
- 9. Adult supervision is required for all kid activities.
- 10. Commercial activity requires Selectboard and/or zoning approval.
- 11. Parking is allowed in the parking lots located at each end of the common, as well as along Common Road in a manner that does not obstruct traffic.
- 12. No parking on the grass.
- 13. No parking is allowed on the Route 128 side of the common.
- 14. Except in emergencies no vehicles are allowed on the common.




Private Drinking Water: A User's Guide

Where does your water come from?



Public water systems (town water) serve at least 15 connections or 25 year-round residents



Private water systems (wells or springs) serve single-family homes, duplexes, or small groups of homes

Drinking water can become contaminated from natural or human causes. As a private water system owner, you are in charge of maintaining and testing the water system. You will not know if your water is contaminated unless you test it. Follow the Private Water Testing Schedule below.

KEY MESSAGES

Private systems are monitored and maintained by their owners. It is important for owners to test their water to make sure it is safe.

Public water systems are tested regularly for more than 90 contaminants as required by the US EPA. The costs for testing are included in customers' water bills.

Public systems send their customers annual Consumer Confidence Reports with specific information about their water.


WHEN TO TEST YOUR WATER:

- Follow the Private Water Testing Schedule on the left.
- A new well is drilled.
- You buy a home served by a well.
- You're expecting a baby.
- Your water changes in smell, taste, or color. Drink bottled water if it does.
- You put in new parts to the system such as a new pump or new pipes.
- The well runs dry and comes back.
- You put in a water treatment system to remove a contaminant.
 Test treated water each year for it.
- After a natural disaster such as a flood or earthquake.

KEY MESSAGES

Arsenic usually gets into drinking water from natural deposits in the earth.

Some places in Vermont have geologic (underground) formations that increase the chances of having arsenic in water.

Consuming water contaminated with arsenic over long periods of time increases the risk of developing bladder, lung, or skin cancer.

WHY SHOULD YOU TEST?

Your water may look, smell, and taste fine, but your water may NOT be safe to drink. Testing is the only way to know what is in your water.

CONTAMINANT LEVELS

The US EPA Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) is the highest amount of a chemical allowed in drinking water. The MCL for arsenic is:

0.010 mg/L (milligrams per liter)

VERMONT LAW REQUIRES:

<u>Testing Drinking Water from Private</u> <u>Water Supplies</u> fact sheet must be given to people drilling new wells and to new homeowners.

Vermont State Certified laboratories must send private well water test results to the State of Vermont.

Ordering Water Test Kits

Order water test kits from the Vermont Department of Health Laboratory or a Vermont State Certified laboratory. The Vermont Department of Health Laboratory provides testing services for bacteria, inorganic chemicals and gross alpha radiation.
