TOWN OFFICE NOTES

Property Tax Bills

You should receive your 2019 property tax bill no later than July 15th. Please contact the town office if you do not receive your tax bill by this date.

The first of four installments is due Thursday, August 15th. Payments will be considered timely if they are received by this date, have an August 15th postmark (postal, FedEx or UPS), or are in the drop box located to the left of the town office door before the office opens at 8:30am on Friday, August 16th. If your taxes are escrowed, it is your responsibility to forward a copy of your tax bill to your mortgage company in a timely manner while retaining a copy for your records.

Please note - If you pay your taxes using Bill Pay (generating a check online through your financial institution), make sure you allow sufficient time for mailing. These envelopes do not bear a postmark therefore will be acknowledged by the date received at the town office not by the date on the check.

Friendly Reminders

- Burn permits are required prior to any burning. Burn permits are available from the Fire Warden (Dennis Angiono, 879-1231), online at https://westfordvt.us/administration/fire-warden/ or from the Town Office. Permits must be obtained on the day you want to burn and are for that day only.
- Yard waste (leaves, brush, etc.) are not considered household garbage, therefore Myers will not collect these materials. Yard waste can be composted or brought to a participating CSWD drop off center.
- Metal items only can be put in the metal dumpster located at the town garage. Surveillance cameras are present and will be used t identify people who drop off items prohibited from the dumpster (furniture, hazardous waste, household trash, etc.).
- Hazardous waste materials must be brought to a participating CSWD drop off center. The Rover will be accepting household hazardous waste in Westford Saturday, July 13th, 9am-1pm at the Town Garage. This is a free service sponsored by the Chittenden Solid Waste District.


momentous days and hours in 1969 when humankind took a giant leap into the





The Chittenden County Regional Planning Commission was founded in 1966 to promote the mutual cooperation of its 19 member municipalities and to facilitate the appropriate development and preservation of the physical and human resources in Chittenden County.

CCRPC is composed of 19 municipal commissioners and five at-large commissioners (representing Agriculture, Conservation/Environment, Socio-Economic/Housing, and Transportation). The legislative body of each of Chittenden County's municipalities selects its own commissioner and alternate commissioner. The Full Commission selects the five at-large representatives. Each commissioner has one vote.

CCRPC's regular monthly meeting is on the third Wednesday of the month at 6:00pm in the Main Conference Room. These meetings are open to the public.



TOWN COMMON USE POLICY

- 1. There is no exclusive use of the common. When scheduling an event, please be aware that this is public property which is used by the general public.
- 2. Clean up after your dog.
- 3. Large gatherings need to be scheduled with the Town Office to avoid conflicts.
- 4. All events must be over by dark, with the exception of Town sanctioned events.
- 5. Noise should be kept at a level so as not to infringe on the rights of neighboring residents.
- 6. All trash and recycling must be picked up and placed in the proper receptacles.
- 7. Tables and chairs must be returned to the gazebo.
- 8. Exercise care around the flower beds and plantings.
- 9. Adult supervision is required for all kid activities.
- 10. Commercial activity requires Selectboard and/or zoning approval.
- 11. Parking is allowed in the parking lots located at each end of the common, as well as along Common Road in a manner that does not obstruct traffic.
- 12. No parking on the grass.
- 13. No parking is allowed on the Route 128 side of the common.
- 14. Except in emergencies no vehicles are allowed on the common.
