## TOWN OFFICE NOTES

#### **Property Tax Bills**

The first installment for property taxes is due Thursday, August 15<sup>th</sup>. Payments will be considered timely if they are received by this date, have an August 15<sup>th</sup> postmark (postal, FedEx or UPS), or are in the drop box located to the left of the town office door <u>before</u> the office opens at 8:30am on Friday, August 16<sup>th</sup>. If your taxes are escrowed, it is your responsibility to forward a copy of your tax bill to your mortgage company in a timely manner while retaining a copy for your records.

**Please note** – If you pay your taxes using Bill Pay (generating a check online through your financial institution), make sure you allow sufficient time for mailing. These envelopes do not bear a postmark therefore will be acknowledged by the date <u>received</u> at the town office not by the date on the check

#### **FRIENDLY REMINDERS**

- Burn permits are available online (<u>www.westfordvt.us</u>), from the Fire Warden (Dennis Angiono, 879-1231) or from the Town Office during office hours. If you have any questions regarding burn permit please contact the Fire Warden.
- Property owners who plan on **replacing driveway culverts** must obtain an Access Permit from the Town before starting the work. Please contact the Town Office for an application.
- Yard waste, such as leaves, brush and topsoil are not considered household garbage. You can compost yard waste or bring it to a participating Chittenden Solid Waste drop off center. For a list of centers please visit www.cswd.net.
- **Metal items** only can be put in the metal dumpster located at the town garage. Non-mental items, such as tires and couches/furniture to name a few. Surveillance cameras are present and will be used to identify people who drop off items prohibited from the dumpster. The State Police will be contacted and provided the information.
- Hazardous waste materials must be brought to a participating CSWD drop off center or the Rover.



#### WESTFORD TRAILS

The Westford Conservation Commission encourages you to explore and enjoy the Westford trails that are spread throughout the town.

- Schultz Trail: About .7 miles up Machia Hill Road, the trail is on the left and marked by a "PUBLIC TRAIL" sign. The trail runs from there to Old #11 Road, parking on the sides of the road at either end.
- <u>Goodrich Trail:</u> Runs from the end of Machia Hill Road all the way to Repa Road in Underhill. This trail runs straight ahead from the end of Machia Hill Road, right past a house, and up into the woods along a logging road (follow the yellow WCC signs). Parking along Machia Hill Road (please don't park in the turnaround area).
- <u>School Trails</u>: Endless options that go through the woods, along the river, and around fields. Travel from the kiosk around the athletic fields and back to the school with "Aliens Love Underpants", a story walk spread over a distance suitable for all ages.
- Maple Shade Forest: Cross Brookside Road from the kiosk and follow that remarkable stone wall up into the woods where trails lead to two different beaver ponds.

Bring your bug spray, <u>always</u> do a tick check after outdoor activities, and feel free to help us maintain the trails by clearing any small debris to the side. Have fun!

#### FRIENDLY REMINDERS FROM YOUR ZONING ADMINISTRATOR

#### **Certificates of Occupancy:**

When is a Certificate of Occupancy (CO) required? A CO is required only for NEW PRINCIPAL STRUCTURES and DWELLINGS, and ADDITIONS THAT DOUBLE OR MORE THE SQUARE FOOTAGE OF PRINCIPAL STRUCTURES.

How can I tell if my project requires a CO? Check your zoning permit. The permit will indicate if your project needs a CO.

My project needs a CO, how do I apply for one? If your project requires a CO, contact the ZA about applying for this permit and scheduling a project inspection.

#### **Business Permitting:**

Increasing numbers of Westford residents are interested in having a business at their property. Having a business at your home falls under "land development" and requires a permit. If you have a business at your property or intend to, please contact the Zoning Administrator.

To encourage more businesses in the Town, Westford has made it easier to have one. The Town's Land Use and Development Regulations allow a range of business uses at properties, provided the activity proposed will be compatible with Town's rural character, recognize natural constraints to development, and not place an unreasonable burden on the Town's ability to provide essential services. Potential businesses that may be permitted range from Home Occupations (Types 1 and 2) to contractor's yards, small scale industry.

#### The Importance of Zoning Compliance:

The real estate market is rebounding and borrowing rates are very competitive. If you plan to sell or refinance your property be aware that most banks, title attorneys and mortgage brokers now require borrowers to verify their property is in zoning compliance. Discovering your property is not compliant can be an unpleasant (and sometimes costly) surprise and can impact the timing of your property closing.

Before you refinance or sell please check on your zoning status with Westford Zoning Administrator Kate Lalley. She can help you resolve any outstanding zoning requirements that may exist before you close. You can reach Kate at zoning admin@westfordvt.us or 878-4587.

Getting into zoning compliance takes time! Depending on the situation, it can take 30 days or longer to achieve zoning compliance. Only afterwards can the ZA certify the full zoning compliance most purchasers and lenders now expect. Plan ahead!

#### **COMMUNITY WASTEWATER**

#### IT'S ALL IN THE PLAN

Excitement is building as we near the final stages of preparing our Preliminary Engineering Report for community wastewater funding. After nearly 12 years of work, the revitalization of our Town Common area now appears closer to reality than ever before.

Timing is everything and it seems our project may become shovel ready in the coming years just as available funding sources become more receptive to the effect community wastewater is having on rural economic development in Vermont.

Working over the years with Stone Environmental and Green Mountain Engineering the Planning Commission has developed both a total construction plan and a phased construction plan to provide our community with the best range of options to address our immediate needs and a variety of funding options.

On July 15, the Planning Commission met with Dr. Donna Rizzo and Kristen Underwood of UVM to discuss the possibility of receiving a National Science Foundation Smart & Connected Communities Grant they are administrating. This grant project will work with three Vermont communities on the construction of smart innovation technologies for community wastewater systems. These technologies are designed to create efficiencies that reduce operating costs and improve available system capacity. Their goal is to work with a small, medium and large Vermont community. According to Dr. Rizzo, the possible selection of Westford for their small community system will allow UVM and the National Science Foundation to create a smart wastewater system with new construction, rather than working to adapt an older system. Ideally, Westford would serve as a model for other small Vermont communities on how to construct a cost-effective system with improved capacity using these new technologies.

#### Why do we need a wastewater system in the Town Common area?

**First:** No development is possible within our Town Common without it. Numerous public outreaches and community surveys overwhelmingly support commercial and residential activities to be developed within our Town Common that will offer essential services vital to our Town.

**Second:** Nearly all of the properties in our Town Common are presently in need of a replacement system and/or have no alternative location available when they do require a replacement system. This includes all of Westford's public and municipal buildings: Our Town Offices, Library, Brick Meeting House and White Church all presently need a wastewater solution.

For example, our Town Offices, the newest of our municipal buildings in the Common area, has a septic system that is around fifty years old and is located under its parking lot. When it fails, we have nowhere to locate a replacement system.

Purchasing the Jackson Farm has provided us with suitable soils for a conventional system. Using various grants previously awarded to us, we have designed a wastewater system that will serve all the properties in our common area and also allow for new commercial with mixed-use development.

There is still a lot of discussion with decisions ahead on how best to fund, construct, tie into and implement this new system. We promise to continue this process in the same thrifty and communicative manner. We encourage you to become informed and contribute to this important community wide discussion.







CCRPC is composed of 19 municipal commissioners and five at-large commissioners (representing Agriculture, Conservation/Environment, Socio-Economic/Housing, and Transportation). The legislative body of each of Chittenden County's municipalities selects its own commissioner and alternate commissioner. The Full Commission selects the five at-large representatives. Each commissioner has one vote.

CCRPC's regular monthly meeting is on the third Wednesday of the month at 6:00pm in the Main Conference Room. These meetings are open to the public.
