#### Reminder - Placing Bulky Items Out for Trash Pickup

The contract between the Town of Westford and Myers for collection of trash and recycling includes the following statement: "Items such as couches, chairs, bedding, shall be considered trash but do not count toward the 64 gallon threshold." Myers will collect bulky items; however, they will charge for the pickup. Some residents have found it costs less to bring their bulky items to a Chittenden Solid Waste District (CSWSD) drop off center rather than have Myers pick them up. # VERMONT BIRTH& DEATH CERTIFICATES

# Effective July 1, 2019

Act 46 (2017) enhances
the security of birth and death
certificates, provides better
protection against misuse
of these legal documents,
and reduces the risk of
identity theft.

# What you need to know:

- Only family members, legal guardians, certain court-appointed parties or their legal representatives can apply for a certified copy of a birth or death certificate. For death certificates, a funeral home or crematorium may also apply for a certified copy.
- Applicants must provide valid identification when applying for a certified copy of a birth or death certificate.
- Nothing will change when ordering copies of marriage, civil union, divorce or dissolution certificates.
- Where to apply for certified copies of birth or death certificates:
  - → Any Vermont Town or City Clerk's Office
  - → Online at: secure.vermont.gov/VSARA/vitalrecords
  - → Vermont State Archives and Records Administration (VSARA)
  - → Vermont Department of Health Vital Records Office

#### Chittenden County Regional Planning Commissioner Representative & Alternate Representative

The Chittenden County Regional Planning Commission was founded in 1966 to promote the mutual cooperation of its 19 member municipalities and to facilitate the appropriate development and preservation of the physical and human resources in Chittenden County.

CCRPC is composed of 19 municipal commissioners and five at-large commissioners (representing Agriculture, Conservation/Environment, Socio-Economic/Housing, and Transportation). The legislative body of each of Chittenden County's municipalities selects its own commissioner and alternate commissioner. The Full Commission selects the five at-large representatives. Each commissioner has one vote.

CCRPC's regular monthly meeting is on the third Wednesday of the month at 6:00pm in the Main Conference Room. These meetings are open to the public.



The groundbreaking graphic novel memoir of a living legend of the civil rights movement, MARCH: BOOK ONE has swiftly become an iconic work. Created by Congressman John

Lewis, Andrew Aydin and Nate Powell, this #1 New York Times bestseller is also a Coretta Scott King Honor book, a required text in classrooms across America, and the first graphic novel to win a Robert F. Kennedy Book Award.



Congressman John Lewis (GA-5) is an American icon, one of the key figures of the civil rights movement. His commitment to justice and nonviolence has taken him from an Alabama sharecropper's farm to the halls of Congress, from a segregated schoolroom to the 1963 March on Washington, and from receiving beatings from state troopers to receiving the Medal of Freedom from the first African-American president. Book One spans John Lewis' youth in rural Alabama, his life-changing meeting with Martin Luther King, Jr., the birth of the Nashville Student Movement, and their battle to tear down segregation through nonviolent lunch counter sit-ins, building to a stunning climax on the steps of City Hall. 




#### DID YOU KNOW?

- Plastic wrap
- Durable plastic (e.g. Tupperware, laundry bins, etc.)
- Styrofoam
- Motor oil or hazardous waste containers

#### FRIENDLY REMINDERS

- Burn permits are available online (<u>www.westfordvt.us</u>), from the Fire Warden (Dennis Angiono, 879-1231) or from the Town Office during office hours. If you have any questions regarding burn permit please contact the Fire Warden.
- Property owners who plan on replacing driveway culverts must obtain an Access Permit from the Town before starting the work. Please contact the Town Office for an application.
- Yard waste, such as leaves, brush and topsoil are not considered household garbage. You can
  compost yard waste or bring it to a participating Chittenden Solid Waste drop off center. For a list of
  centers please visit <u>www.cswd.net</u>.
- Metal items only can be put in the metal dumpster located at the town garage. Non-mental items, such as tires and couches/furniture to name a few. Surveillance cameras are present and will be used to identify people who drop off items prohibited from the dumpster. The State Police will be contacted and provided the information.
- Hazardous waste materials must be brought to a participating CSWD drop off center or the Rover.




# WESTFORD SCHOOL NEWS
