### Reminder - Placing Bulky Items Out for Trash Pickup

The contract between the Town of Westford and Myers for collection of trash and recycling includes the following statement: "Items such as couches, chairs, bedding, shall be considered trash but do not count toward the 64 gallon threshold." Myers will collect bulky items; however, they will charge for the pickup. Some residents have found it costs less to bring their bulky items to a Chittenden Solid Waste District (CSWSD) drop off center rather than have Myers pick them up. ### **Active Hunting:**

Hunting is a permitted activity in the Maple Shade Town Forest. Hunting of any species is permitted during deer and turkey seasons which are in effect now through spring 2020.

### Take Precautions: WEAR ORANGE, LEASH DOGS, MAKE NOISE

Access for Hunting: The Conservation Commission is working on providing public access that is not within the "Gun Free School Zone". Currently, hunter access to the forest must be with permission across private land. Please refer to the "Gun Free Zone" map link listed at the end of the Long-Term Management Plan posted on the town's website for location of the gun free zone.

### **Trails:**

Please let us know if you see downed trees or other required maintenance to any of the trails. We're happy to go out and clean things up!

### **CAN I RECYCLE THAT?**

Did you know that you are not supposed to put your recycling in plastic bags of any kind? The <u>only</u> exception to this is shredded office paper, which is accepted only if it's in a CLEAR BAG that's tightly closed.

Here are some other items that do NOT belong in your recycling bin:

- Dirty containers
- Plastic wrap
- Durable plastic (e.g. Tupperware, laundry bins, etc.)
- Styrofoam
- Motor oil or hazardous waste containers

Novelist Will Thomas had been a logger in Maine, a crew member on a fishing boat in Alaska, a prizefighter on the West Coast, a script writer in Los Angeles, and a journalist in Kansas City, Chicago, and New York. In 1946 he, his wife, and three children abandoned a plan to move to Haiti to escape racial prejudice in the United States. Instead, they made the improbable decision to purchase a home in tiny Westford, Vermont, twenty miles northeast of Burlington. At the time, the Thomases were the only non-white members of the community. The Seeking is the grim account of the Thomases' lives before Vermont, their decision to give living in America one last chance, and the moving, heartfelt, uplifting story of their time among the people of Westford—a life, writes Thomas, "not based on race, but on what we and they [were] like as human beings." The Seeking is an important work of 20th century African American literature. The Seeking is both a story of one remarkable African-American family and a story of New England race relations in the first half of the twentieth century.



### WINTER IS COMING!



### What you need to know about the coming road conditions

- Plowing: begins when the snow has accumulated 2-3 inches. Each plow route takes the road crew about 4 hours to complete.
- Sand: applied to all gravel roads. Some particles may be large enough to cause windshield damage. Use caution and avoid following other vehicles closely.
- Mailboxes: Westford does NOT repair or replace mailboxes damaged by the plow.
- **Plowing Across Town Roads:** plowing snow from driveways across town roads is prohibited.

### Reminders:

- Each winter storm is different, roads may be icy and sand may be loose. Drive slow and know what your vehicle is capable of.
- Watch for walkers and wildlife. It will be more difficult to see pedestrians and recreational users of roads this time of year due to snowbanks. Walkers, bikers and other users can do their part by wearing bright, reflective clothing.

The Chittenden County Regional Planning Commission was founded in 1966 to promote the mutual cooperation of its 19 member municipalities and to facilitate the appropriate development and preservation of the physical and human resources in Chittenden County.

CCRPC is composed of 19 municipal commissioners and five at-large commissioners (representing Agriculture, Conservation/Environment, Socio-Economic/Housing, and Transportation). The legislative body of each of Chittenden County's municipalities selects its own commissioner and alternate commissioner. The Full Commission selects the five at-large representatives. Each commissioner has one vote.

CCRPC's regular monthly meeting is on the third Wednesday of the month at 6:00pm in the Main Conference Room. These meetings are open to the public.

# WESTFORD'S FUTURE: PRIORITIES & ACTIONS



More than 80 individuals attended the second Westford's Future meeting to discuss the ideas and opportunities identified at the September 19<sup>th</sup> forums and through online submission. The community reviewed and prioritized fourteen ideas by assigning points to each– some of which were merged:

- #1 Boost Local Business and Economic Development & Improve Broadband and Cell Connectivity 94 Points
- #2 Improve Traffic Safety, Walkability, and Bike-ability 92 Points
- #3 Advance Community Events and Celebrations & Improve Community and Town Communications & Advance the Arts in Westford 86 Points
- Build a Community Playground on the Common 44 Points
- Develop and Improve Housing 42 Points
- Market and Share Westford's Assets 22 Points
- Create Education and Skill Sharing Opportunities & Start a Tool and Gear Sharing Program -16 Points
- Create a co- Working Space in the White Church 7 Points
- Improve Shared Transportation Options 3 Points
- Build Community Wastewater Infrastructure *Planning Commission Currently Leading Project.*

While the community can move any of the above projects forward, the group broke put into three groups to discuss the **top three priorities**, organize task forces and develop action plans. Vermont Housing on Rural Development will share a final report in the next few weeks that captures the process – all of the inputs, the visiting resource team, action ideas, and the final action plans.

We are working now to identify chairs for each of the task forces that will help to coordinate and lead the work forward. Chairs will receive the action plans and list of task force signups and will be in touch with task forces to coordinate next meetings and the work ahead.

### WESTFORD SCHOOL NEWS

### **School Safety Update**

The Essex Westford School District is updating safety protocols to include procedures for an active threat. Building upon the success of our existing emergency procedures, we will expand responses that reflect a more situationally driven approach which recognizes that no single response fits every potential scenario. The belief is that having more options will keep our students, staff, and community safer. Over time, starting with staff at our high school and technical center campus, EWSD will be rolling out the US Department of Homeland Security's recommended protocol - *Run*, *Hide*, *Fight*. This work will not replace any of the current safety protocols or regular drills - each of those will remain and be actively reinforced across the District and throughout the school year. What is new, is the building of greater situational awareness around responding to an active threat. An "active threat" is defined as any incident which by its deliberate nature creates an immediate threat to life or presents an imminent danger such as an active shooter. ### **Emergency Communication:**

In the event of an emergency, our top priority is working with first responders for the safety of all students. You can expect that once students are safe and with the approval of the proper authorities we will communicate directly with families using the contact information on file. It is important that families keep contact information up to date. For safety reasons, we will communicate verified, accurate information that doesn't compromise the safety of students or impede a law enforcement investigation.

### **Featured Activities**

In October, Westford students presented at the annual Rowland Foundation Conference They shared their stories, lessons learned, and next steps in their efforts to promote awareness in matters of social justice and equity. In the past two years, students have initiated the raising of the Black Lives Matters Flag and the Pride Flag, as well successfully advocated for a change in the language of the dress code in which they identified areas of inequity and bias.

We know that quality family-school communication is key to each child's learning and we have set up a series of opportunities to provide ongoing communication with parents about their student's experiences throughout the year.
