TOWN OFFICE NOTES

FY'21 Budget Informational Meeting

The Selectboard will hold an informational meeting Thursday January 9th at 7pm at the town office (lower level) to present the draft town budget. This is an excellent opportunity for residents to provide feedback prior to finalization of the budget before being voted on in March 2020.

Petition Deadlines

Petitions for articles to be considered for inclusion in the warning for Town Meeting are due by 4:30 p.m. Wednesday, January 15th. Petitions must be signed by at least 5% of the registered voters (a minimum of 85). Please be sure that the person signing the petition is a registered voter and that their name is legible.

Petitions for elected offices (e.g. Selectboard, etc.) can be picked up at the town office and must be submitted no later than 4:30 p.m. on Monday, January 27th. Petitions must be signed by a minimum of 17 registered voters. Please contact the town office for a complete list of offices with terms expiring in March 2020.

Important Dates - Town Meeting & Presidential Primary Election

- January 9th (Thursday) Selectboard FY'21 budget informational meeting, 7:00 p.m. at the town office (lower level).
- January 15th (Wednesday) 4:30 p.m. deadline to file petitions signed by at least 5% of the registered voters (a minimum of 85) with the Town Clerk for articles to be considered for inclusion in the warning for Town Meeting. Be sure that the person who signs the petition is a registered voter and signs their name as it appears on the checklist.
- January 17th (Friday) Absentee ballots for the Presidential Primary will be delivered to the town office by this date.
- January 27th (Monday) 4:30 p.m. deadline for filing with the Town Clerk nominating petitions and consent forms for local offices to be filled by Australian ballot. Please make sure your name is as it appears on the voter checklist and to fill in the office you are running for (including length of term) before circulating your petition.
- February 12th ((Wednesday) absentee ballots for Town Meeting will be available.
- March 2nd (Monday) 5:00 p.m. deadline to request an absentee ballot for Town Meeting and the Presidential Primary. Please note: we are required to ask which ballot, Democrat or Republican, you want. When requesting an absentee ballot for the Presidential Primary, please indicate which ballot you would like.
- March 2nd (Monday) 7:00 p.m., Town Meeting and public hearing for Australian ballot questions (including town budget), at the Westford School in the gym.
- March 3rd (Tuesday) Voting day for Australian ballot articles. Polls will be open from 7am to 7pm at the Westford School in the library. The entrance to the library is located to the right of the main entrance.

If you have any questions regarding Town Meeting or the Presidential Primary, please call or email the town office.

CAN I RECYCLE THAT?

Did you know that you are not supposed to put your recycling in plastic bags of any kind? The <u>only</u> exception to this is shredded office paper, which is accepted only if it's in a CLEAR BAG that's tightly closed.

Here are some other items that do **NOT** belong in your recycling bin:

- Dirty containers
- Plastic wrap
- Durable plastic (e.g. Tupperware, laundry bins, etc.)
- Motor oil or hazardous waste containers







WINTER IS HERE!



What you need to know about winter road conditions

- **Plowing:** begins when the snow has accumulated 2-3 inches. Each plow route takes the road crew about 4 hours to complete.
- **Sand:** applied to all gravel roads. Some particles may be large enough to cause windshield damage. Use caution and avoid following other vehicles closely.
- Mailboxes: Westford does NOT repair or replace mailboxes damaged by the plow.
- Plowing Across Town Roads: plowing snow from driveways across town roads is prohibited.

Reminders:

- Each winter storm is different, roads may be icy and sand may be loose. Drive slow and know what your vehicle is capable of.
- Watch for walkers and wildlife. It will be more difficult to see pedestrians and recreational users of roads this time of year due to snowbanks. Walkers, bikers and other users can do their part by wearing bright, reflective clothing.
- Some VAST trails cross Westford Roads. Know where the trails are and watch for crossing snowmobiles. You can find a



New Bremen, Minnesota, 1961. It was a time of innocence and hope for a country with a new, young president. But for 13 year old Frank Drum it was a grim summer in which death visited frequently and assumed many forms. Accident. Nature. Suicide. Murder.

Frank begins the season preoccupied with the concerns of any teenage boy, but when tragedy unexpectedly strikes his family—he finds himself thrust into an adult world full of secrets, lies, adultery, and betrayal, suddenly called upon to demonstrate a maturity and gumption beyond his years.

Told from Frank's perspective forty years after that fateful summer, *Ordinary Grace* is a brilliantly moving account of a boy standing at the door of his young manhood, trying to understand a world that seems to be falling apart around him. It is an unforgettable novel about discovering the terrible price of wisdom and the enduring grace of God.

Active Hunting:

Hunting is a permitted activity in the Maple Shade Town Forest. <u>Hunting of any species is permitted during deer and</u> turkey seasons which are in effect now through spring 2020.

Take Precautions: WEAR ORANGE, LEASH DOGS, MAKE NOISE

Access for Hunting: The Conservation Commission is working on providing public access that is not within the "Gun Free School Zone". Currently, hunter access to the forest must be with permission across private land. Please refer to the "Gun Free Zone" map link listed at the end of the Long-Term Management Plan posted on the town's website for location of the gun free zone.

School Trails:

Please be mindful of the cross-country skiing tracks that have been laid down and do not walk where the tracks have been set; please stay to the side.

Trails:

Please let us know if you see downed trees or other required maintenance to any of the trails. We're happy to go out and clean things up!

Membership:

The Conservation Commission is in need of a 5th member. We meet once a month on the third Wednesday at 6:00pm at the Town Office. Outdoor activities are a big part of what we do as well as furthering the preservation of Westford's rural character.

The Chittenden County Regional Planning Commission was founded in 1966 to promote the mutual cooperation of its 19 member municipalities and to facilitate the appropriate development and preservation of the physical and human resources in Chittenden County.

CCRPC is composed of 19 municipal commissioners and five at-large commissioners (representing Agriculture, Conservation/Environment, Socio-Economic/Housing, and Transportation). The legislative body of each of Chittenden County's municipalities selects its own commissioner and alternate commissioner. The Full Commission selects the five at-large representatives. Each commissioner has one vote.

CCRPC's regular monthly meeting is on the third Wednesday of the month at 6:00pm in the Main Conference Room. These meetings are open to the public.

The Child Mind Institute defines self-regulation as "the ability to manage your emotions and behavior in accordance with the demands of the situation. It includes being able to resist highly emotional reactions to upsetting stimuli, to calm yourself down when you get upset, to adjust to a change in expectations and to handle frustration without an outburst. It is a set of skills that enables children, as they mature, to direct their own behavior towards a goal, despite the unpredictability of the world and our own feelings."

The Most Wonderful Time of the Year

The EWSD board would like to welcome you to the most wonderful time of the year: budget season! Each year at this time, the board and administration begin the process of building the budget for the next calendar year. The budget focus for FY21 is Educational Equity and Student Achievement. Educational Equity means that "every student has access to the educational resources and rigor they need at the right moment in their education across race, gender, language, disability, sexual orientation, family background and/or family income" ("Vermont Multi-Tiered System of Supports Field Guide." MTSS 2019 Field Guide). We currently have a gap in Student Achievement, as our students who are white and economically secure perform better in school and on state assessments than our students who live in poverty, students with disabilities, and students of color. We owe it to all of our students to close this gap and make student achievement mean success for ALL students.

The board kicked off the season with a night of Pie and Pie Charts to explain what ingredients go into creating a budget. Thank you to everyone who came and enjoyed dessert with us! The first budget session took place on December 10th and focused on Values and Outcomes as they align with our vision and Multi-Year Instructional Strategic Plan. Over the next few months, the board will host a series of opportunities for the community to become more informed about the budget.
