For your convenience, you may mail or drop off the fee and rabies certificate along with a self-addressed stamped envelope and we will mail the license to you. The fee is \$13.00 unless your dog is spayed or neutered, in which case the fee is \$11.00.

YARD CLEAN UP

When cleaning up your yard, please keep the following in mind:

- Burn permits are required prior to any burning. Burn permits are available online
 (https://westfordvt.us/administration/fire-warden/), from the Fire Warden (Dennis Angiono, 879-1231) or from the Town Office during regular office hours.
- Yard waste, such as leaves, brush and topsoil are <u>not</u> considered household garbage, therefore Myers will not collect
 these materials when picking up your garbage. You can compost yard waste or bring it to a participating CSWD drop

SUMMER ROADS

What you need to know about warm weather road conditions

- Road Projects: many projects are being done on the roads at this time. Slow down and give crews space to work.
- **Dust:** roads can become dusty in dry weather and potholes can appear in heavily traveled areas. Going the speed limit can reduce dusty and damage roads.
- **Roadside Mowing:** roadsides are mowed to increase visibility and keep invasive plants at bay. Mowing occurs twice a year: once in late spring/early summer and once later in the summer.
- **Traffic Speeds:** due to the hard-packed conditions of the roads this time of year, overall vehicle speeds can increase. Be aware of speed limits.
- **Heavy Loads:** do damage to thawing roads. Traveling roads with heavy equipment may be prohibited at any time.
- Repairs: roads are repaired as weather allows. Know that this takes time, it might take the road crew some time to get to your road. Highly traveled roads in poor condition are given priority.

Reminders:

Watch for increased pedestrian traffic including walkers, bikers, horseback riders etc. Please slow down and
give other users of the road lots of room as you pass.

PLANNING COMMISSION NEWS

The Planning Commission is excited to share that we have a newly formed committee that will be leading our wastewater project public outreach. The purpose of the committee is to share with residents and stakeholders the wastewater options being studied along with the economic and financial effects a community wastewater system could have on the town. Seth Jensen from the Westford Planning Commission will chair the committee. Other committee members are Heather Armata, Pat Haller, J.B. Hinds, Eric Ford, and Gordon Gebauer. The first working group meeting was held June 22nd at 6:00 PM at the Town Office and virtually using Zoom. The outreach committee meetings are warned public meetings, will have posted agendas and minutes. In addition to the committee's outreach effort, the Planning Commission will continue to update the project frequently asked questions on the town website, https://westfordvt.us/town-center-revitalization-projects/. Public engagement and community engagement is always welcome, stay on the lookout for upcoming meeting notices.

The Chittenden County Regional Planning Commission (CCRPC) recently notified the town that the 2022 CCRPC Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) budget includes \$20,000.00 to fund an assessment of Westford village stormwater treatment and infrastructure or lack thereof. The funding includes a local \$4,000.00 match that will be paid for by the Westford Planning Commission special projects budget. This project is part of a multi-year effort to properly treat stormwater in the Town Center Area and explore redevelopment of the 1705 Route 128 property. Through this project, Westford hopes to not only generate a more resilient solution, but also look at alternatives for the culvert draining the Common to reduce erosion/sedimentation and phosphorus discharge into the Browns River and to advance the redevelopment possibilities of the 1705 Rte 128 Property, which is also a brownfield site.

The Selectboard recently adopted the proposed amendment to the Westford Land Use & Development Regulations at its June 10th meeting. The new regulations are in immediate effect. The document is being finalized and will be available on the town website or in hard copy for viewing or purchase at the town office in the next few weeks.

When Vermont lifted the state of emergency it also lifted some of the open meeting law provisions that were put in place during the pandemic. The town is evaluating virtual and in person meeting formats and identifying what this will look like in the future. In the meantime, the Planning Commission will hold regular meetings both virtually and in person. This is subject to change once a final determination is in place. We will continue to post meeting times and places in advance with the meeting agenda.

Our regularly scheduled meetings are generally held the 1st and 3rd Mondays of the month via Zoom, please join us. For any planning related questions reach out to our Town Planner, Melissa Manka at planner@westfordvt.us.






TRASH, RECYCLING & FOOD SCRAPS IN WESTFORD

Can I Recycle That?

Did you know that you are not supposed to put your recycling in plastic bags of any kind? The only exception to this is shredded office paper, which is accepted only if it's in a CLEAR BAG that's tightly closed.

Here are some other items that do **NOT** belong in your recycling bin:

- Dirty containers
- Plastic wrap
- Durable plastic (e.g., Tupperware, laundry bins, etc.)
- Styrofoam
- Motor oil or hazardous waste containers





What are food scraps?

Food scraps are parts of food that are typically discarded rather than eaten: peels, rinds, cores, eggshells, seeds, pits, bones, shells, coffee grounds and filters, loose-leaf tea, and fats/oils/grease. Food scraps is also food that was eaten but not finished: "plate scraps" or leftovers that went bad. Any type of food can become food scraps including bread, pasta, soup, vegetables, fruit, sauces, meat, fish, dairy, sweets, etc.

What should I do with meat and bones?

If you compost in your yard, the law allows you to put meat and bones in the trash, so they don't attract animals to your composting bin. If you chose to bring food scraps to a drop-off center, you can include meat and bones with the rest of your food scraps.

SEASONAL COMPOSTING TIPS: SUMMER

- Break up material (both food scraps and browns) into small pieces. This allows for decomposition to happen quickly, meaning you'll have usable compost faster!
- Water your compost! If compost is dry, it stops generating heat. Keeping compost moist will help things decompose quickly.
- Dry grass and eggshells make a great addition to your pile. For best decomposition, your pile should be 1/4th browns and 3/4ths other items such as food scraps, coffee grounds, and green lawn clippings.




News from the Westford Historical Society

WESTFORD SUMMER CONCERTS - 2021

We are happy to announce our Westford Summer Concerts series line up for 2021! We have a great season coming up. All shows are scheduled for July and August and are all on Sunday evenings starting from 7 – 8 pm for the main musical performance. We have also been able to confirm that food trucks will also be setting up starting at 6 pm so your evening can be extended to include dinner on the Common as well. So come early, stay late, and bring the family for a real summertime outdoorsy treat.

We were extremely lucky last year in that we did not get any rain cancellations. In a usual year, if rain seems pending, we will just move the show inside the Red Brick Meeting House; however, Covid restrictions have made that option unavailable, and we have to assume that the same conditions may apply this season as well. With that in mind, (2) rain dates have been built into the schedule. If a headline band gets rained out, they will perform at one of the remaining rain dates. If the rain dates do not need to be exercised for the headliners, then local fill-in bands are willing to take those dates at short notice, but we don't know who that will be ahead of time. So, we will have concerts **every** Sunday night in July and August (except July 4th) unless it rains on a Sunday evening.

As like last year, we are asking all participants to adhere to Covid protocols that are in effect for each date. We would assume that would entail social distancing practices for all attendees that are not from the same household and wearing of masks whenever not able to maintain proper social distances from others. BYO chairs, blankets, picnic baskets, beverages, etc. for those not purchasing from vendors.

We ask everyone to clean up any trash and use the standard hiker's policy of "carry in, carry out". There are (2 sets of trash cans and recycle barrels at the Common, so please seek them out and use them. No cars should be parked on the Common directly, but cars can be parked on the side of the roads that ring the Common, preferably on the south side dirt road, or use the designated parking areas at east and west ends of the Common. Please be courteous and leave spaces available at the west end area so that patrons of the Westford Country Store that are not attending the concert can get in and out for store purchases.

Each commissioner has one vote.

WESTSTOCK - COMING JULY 31

We are happy to announce a special fundraising concert event to benefit improvements to the Red Brick Meeting House. This will be a special night of music from 6-9 pm, maybe a little longer, taking place at the gazebo at the Westford Common, just like a typical Sunday night concert. The idea was conceived from the great response we have been getting from the Red Brick Coffee House, especially since moving outdoors during the Covid restrictions given to indoor events. Many talented Westford folk have been attending these open mics over the last few years and we'd like to take the opportunity to share this talent with the greater public as well. This special "all-star" rendition of the coffee house will feature a "house" band with numerous special guest artists coming up on stage to lend a hand at some great down home home-made live music. Think of this as Westford's version of The Last Waltz, which was the last official concert The Band did and made a movie to record the event. Only this time we are celebrating the last of the restrictions for music events due to Covid-19. We are calling it **Weststock**.

The Red Brick Meeting House has been the home of the Westford Red Brick Coffee House, which has been running for the last 5 years. This gem of a building and now a heritage of Westford public spaces needs some TLC and basic maintenance to keep it sound and operating for the future. This last year has restricted operations at the building, preventing typical streams of income for maintenance (and even just basic heat and electricity). We are hoping this event can raise some needed funds and give the town a great night of entertainment as well. We expect to have many styles of music to present, from classical guitar and singer songwriter, to blues, country, and rock oriented presentations. There should be something for everyone to like. Some of the projects we'd like to get going at the building are refinishing the floor, adding a sound system, some exterior painting, and restoring a back porch that the building used to have at the door leading to the kitchen area, but was removed years ago for whatever reason.

We are asking for donations for this event, though it will be freely presented in the format of the Sunday night shows, only on a Saturday night. Some sort of funding site will be set up shortly for people to buy "tickets" on line in advance (or even during the show now that there is WiFi available at the Common). A tip bucket will be also present for any last minute contributions. There will also be a sale of many of the old wooden seats that were used at the building but have been put aside and replaced by the folding chairs and racking system now in place. You can own a piece of history and help our cause at the same time. Chairs will be available for sale starting right after the July 4th parade and at this event.

Look for more information to come via Front Porch Forum or posted at the bulletin boards at the Library and Town Office. Thank you all in advance for supporting this event. It should be fantastic.
