Selectboard FY'25 Budget Workshops

The Selectboard will begin working on the FY'24 Budget in October, Upcoming workshops will be held on:

- 12/28
- 1/11
- 1/25

If needed, additional meetings will be held. The Board encourages residents to attend these meetings to provide feedback to assists the Board in developing a budget to be voted on in March 2024.

New Selectboard Positions

On November 1st, the townspeople came together in a Special Town Meeting and voted to add two new selectboard positions to the board, raising the number of members from 3 to 5. In the March 2024 Town Meeting there will be 4 Selectboard positions available. They are as follows: 3 Year Term, 3 Year Term (2 Years Remaining), 2 Year Term, and 1 Year Term. When filling out your petitions please indicate which term you would like. For a full list of available positions, not just selectboard, please contact the Town Office.

Petition Deadlines

Petitions for articles to be considered for inclusion in the warning for Town Meeting are due by 4:30pm Thursday, January 18th. Petitions must be signed by at least 5% of the registered voters (a minimum of 87). Please be sure that the person signing the petition is a registered voter and that their name is legible.

Elected offices (Selectboard, etc.) – Candidates are required to file a petition signed by at least 18 registered voters and a Consent of Candidate form to run for an office. The deadline to submit the petition and consent form is 4:30 pm on Monday January 29th. The forms can be picked up at the Town Office or printed off the town website. Please contact the Town Office for a list of offices with terms expiring in March 2024.

WINTER ROADS

What you need to know about winter road conditions.

- **Plowing:** begins when the snow has accumulated 2-3 inches. Each plow route takes the road crew about 4 hours to complete.
- **Sand:** applied to all gravel roads. Some particles may be large enough to cause windshield damage. Use caution and avoid following other vehicles closely.
- **Mailboxes:** Westford does <u>NOT</u> repair or replace mailboxes damaged by the plow.
- Plowing Across Town Roads: plowing snow from driveways across town roads is prohibited.

Reminders:

- Each winter storm is different, roads may be icy and sand may be loose. Drive slow and know what your vehicle is capable of.
- Watch for walkers and wildlife. It will be more difficult to see pedestrians and recreational users of roads this time of year due to snowbanks. Walkers, bikers and other users can do their part by wearing bright, reflective clothing.
- Some VAST trails cross Westford Roads. Know where the trails are and watch for crossing snowmobiles. You can find a list of VAST trails here: <u>https://vtvast.org/trails.html</u>
- Several hunting seasons occur during early winter. Watch for vehicles parked on the side of roads for hunting access. Pedestrians & pets should wear orange/yellow reflective clothing during hunting seasons to help ensure they are seen. DOG WARDEN

The Town of Westford is looking for someone who is interested in serving as Dog Warden. What is a Dog Warden? A Dog Warden is a person who helps dog owners comply with the Westford Dog Ordinance.

Qualifications: A love for dogs, the ability to communicate effectively and a location to bring dogs until they can be reunited with their owner to name a few. You may think you need a kennel to be a Dog Warden. This is not the case. However, a stray dog does need to be kept in a healthy environment until it is reunited with the owner. A healthy environment includes shelter, food, water, and a suitable area for them to relieve themselves.

The Dog Warden position receives an annual stipend of \$500 and there are funds available for training, supplies and mileage. The Town also has supplies, including a dog house, that can be utilized. TRASH, RECYCLING & FOOD SCRAPS IN WESTFORD

Can I Recycle That?

Did you know that you are not supposed to put your recycling in plastic bags of any kind? The <u>only</u> exception to this is shredded office paper, which is accepted only if it's in a CLEAR BAG that's tightly closed.

Here are some other items that do <u>NOT</u> belong in your recycling bin:

- Dirty containers
- Plastic wrap
- Durable plastic (e.g., Tupperware, laundry bins, etc.)
- Styrofoam
- Motor oil or hazardous waste containers

Food Scraps (Effective July 1, 2020, per Act 148, food scraps are banned from landfills.)

What are food scraps?

Food scraps are parts of food that are typically discarded rather than eaten: peels, rinds, cores, eggshells, seeds, pits, bones, shells, coffee grounds and filters, loose-leaf tea, and fats/oils/grease. Food scraps is also food that was eaten but not finished: "plate scraps" or leftovers that went bad. Any type of food can become food scraps including bread, pasta, soup, vegetables, fruit, sauces, meat, fish, dairy, sweets, etc.

What should I do with meat and bones?

If you compost in your yard, the law allows you to put meat and bones in the trash, so they don't attract animals to your composting bin. If you chose to bring food scraps to a drop-off center, you can include meat and bones with the rest of your food scraps.

SEASONAL COMPOSTING TIPS: WINTER

- Leaves and grass clippings are valuable compost materials because they are carbon rich. Add them in small batches to avoid matting (too many leaves clump together and slow down the compost process)
- Cover your pile or use an enclosed composter to keep things moist but not sodden. This will also deter pests like bears, raccoons, and mice.
- Other items that can go in your compost this time of year include wood ash and the skeletons of annual flowers & plants. Break down large-bodied plants like tomatoes and broccoli before adding them to your pile.
- Store compost material like leaves & grass in a burlap sack near your pile for adding with food scraps.





Winter can be a difficult time for dogs to go missing. To help ensure your furry companions are safe this winter you can do the following:

- Clear snow from against fencing to avoid over the fence escapes (as snow piles up it can be easier for your dog to go over).
- When your dog is let outside make sure they are wearing reflective and/or high visibility orange/yellow.
- Always make sure your dog is wearing a name tag with a phone number! If you find that dangling tags get lost easily look for "slide" style tags.
- If you use an invisible fence ensure your batteries are still in working order.
- Keep cable runs well lubricated to ensure they are working properly. Cable runs and tie-outs may require more moisture this time of year.
- Train and Maintain a reliable recall. Teaching your dog to come when called reliably is one of the best tools for keeping your dog safe this winter. Practice in a safe area before letting your dog loose. Please make sure that when in public your dog can reliably come when called even if distracted by: wildlife, people, children, livestock, and other dogs.

The Clean Water Advisory Committee

The CWAC oversees the Chittenden County Regional Planning Commission activities and policy development regarding but not limited to, the Vermont Lake Champlain Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) Plan and its related plans and programs. CCRPC Lamoille Basin Water Quality Council

The responsibilities of a BWQC as outlined § 39-502 of the CWSP Rule are:

(a) The purpose of a BWQC is to establish policy and make decisions for the CWSP regarding the most significant water d-quality impairments that exist in the basin and prioritizing the clean water projects that will address those impairments based on the basin plan.

(b) When prioritizing clean water projects and prioritizing the most significant water quality impairments in the basin, the BWQC shall consult with the basin plan and CWSP and utilize the Agency's project selection protocols.

(c) The BWQC shall participate in the basin planning process established in 10 V.S.A. § 1253(d).

Potential members should be:

- knowledgeable on clean water topics for the applicable basin
- Interested in prioritizing and selecting non-regulatory clean water projects for funding at quarterly BWQC meetings
- Interested in participating in the applicable Tactical Basin Planning process

Start the New Year by Volunteering with the Westford Recreation Department!

- **Board member needed!** Spend 2 hours per month, generally the first Tuesday from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. meeting with the WRD Committee to discuss and plan programming. Occasional program involvement as desired.

Some policy clean-up was done at the December WRD Committee Meeting. Here are the current general policies regarding WRD Programs.

- It is strongly suggested that all recreation programs for youth have at least two WRD background checked adults on premises unless special conditions exist and the Committee has approved it ahead of time.
- All volunteers must be background checked every two years.
- All <u>participants</u> must be on the current roster in order to participate.
- <u>Registration deadlines</u> for all programs will be 7 days before the program starts. For pick-up or drop in programs, registration will be ongoing.
- Participants who <u>register late</u> must be approved by the Coaches and verified by the Recreation Coordinator before participating.
- There will be a \$10.00 late registration fee after the program deadline.
- <u>Participation fees</u> are waived for up to three children per volunteer leading the program.
- The Treasurer and Recreation Coordinator should both <u>approve invoices</u> to be paid.
- The Recreation Coordinator may purchase <u>supplies</u> up to \$100.00 per program. Should then report at the next WRD Committee meeting.
