## **WINTER ROADS**

What you need to know about winter road conditions.

- **Plowing:** begins when the snow has accumulated 2-3 inches. Each plow route takes the road crew about 4 hours to complete.
- **Sand:** applied to all gravel roads. Some particles may be large enough to cause windshield damage. Use caution and avoid following other vehicles closely.
- **Mailboxes:** Westford does <u>NOT</u> repair or replace mailboxes damaged by the plow.
- Plowing Across Town Roads: plowing snow from driveways across town roads is prohibited.

#### Reminders:

- Each winter storm is different, roads may be icy and sand may be loose. Drive slow and know what your vehicle is capable of.
- Watch for walkers and wildlife. It will be more difficult to see pedestrians and recreational users of roads this time of year due to snowbanks. Walkers, bikers and other users can do their part by wearing bright, reflective clothing.
- Some VAST trails cross Westford Roads. Know where the trails are and watch for crossing snowmobiles. You can find a

- Several hunting seasons occur during early winter. Watch for vehicles parked on the side of roads for hunting access.
   Pedestrians & pets should wear orange/yellow reflective clothing during hunting seasons to help ensure they are seen.

## **DOG WARDEN**

The Town of Westford is looking for someone who is interested in serving as Dog Warden. What is a Dog Warden? A Dog Warden is a person who helps dog owners comply with the Westford Dog Ordinance.

Qualifications: A love for dogs, the ability to communicate effectively and a location to bring dogs until they can be reunited with their owner to name a few. You may think you need a kennel to be a Dog Warden. This is not the case. However, a stray dog does need to be kept in a healthy environment until it is reunited with the owner. A healthy environment includes shelter, food, water, and a suitable area for them to relieve themselves.

The Dog Warden position receives an annual stipend of \$500 and there are funds available for training, supplies and mileage. The Town also has supplies, including a dog house, that can be utilized. #### School Trails winter use:

In an effort to accommodate everyone, so we can all enjoy the trails, please follow these guidelines:

- The trails are for everyone. Please be respectful of all folks on the trails.
- Please maintain "lanes" on the groomed trails. The set track is for cross country skiers, the corduroy is to be shared by snowshoers and skate skiers.
- Please keep dogs off the corduroy for the safety of other users.
- Be aware of other people on the trail. Skiers will be traveling much faster than snowshoers, so stay alert, stay safe.
- WCC Ski Report will be posted on FPF to inform people of the status of the groomed trails, so keep an eye out for it!

#### **Maple Shade Trails:**

Once again, Evan Aiken is doing some forestry work according to the <u>Long-Term Management Plan</u> of the Maple Shade Town Forest. Please heed trail closure signs. Come learn all about this micro-project with Chittenden County Forester Ethan Tapper at Westford's Winterfest on Saturday, February 17! Ethan's walk will begin at 1:00 pm. Meet at the bonfire site and be prepared for the weather and terrain with slippery and uneven surfaces. Approximately 2 hours.

#### **Downed trees:**

After the last high-wind storms, we've seen quite a few trees down or leaning, and lots of debris on our town trails. Could trail users do their part by flicking sticks and moving branches off the trail? Let us know of any larger trees down so we can clean up out there. Please be aware of any dangerously leaning trees (they're called widow-makers for a reason)!


## TRASH, RECYCLING & FOOD SCRAPS IN WESTFORD

#### Can I Recycle That?

Did you know that you are not supposed to put your recycling in plastic bags of any kind? The <u>only</u> exception to this is shredded office paper, which is accepted only if it's in a CLEAR BAG that's tightly closed.

Here are some other items that do NOT belong in your recycling bin:

- Dirty containers
- Plastic wrap
- Durable plastic (e.g., Tupperware, laundry bins, etc.)
- Styrofoam
- Motor oil or hazardous waste containers



#### **Food Scraps** (Effective July 1, 2020, per Act 148, food scraps are banned from landfills.)

#### What are food scraps?

Food scraps are parts of food that are typically discarded rather than eaten: peels, rinds, cores, eggshells, seeds, pits, bones, shells, coffee grounds and filters, loose-leaf tea, and fats/oils/grease. Food scraps is also food that was eaten but not finished: "plate scraps" or leftovers that went bad. Any type of food can become food scraps including bread, pasta, soup, vegetables, fruit, sauces, meat, fish, dairy, sweets, etc.

#### What should I do with meat and bones?

If you compost in your yard, the law allows you to put meat and bones in the trash, so they don't attract animals to your composting bin. If you chose to bring food scraps to a drop-off center, you can include meat and bones with the rest of your food scraps.

#### SEASONAL COMPOSTING TIPS: WINTER

- Leaves and grass clippings are valuable compost materials because they are carbon rich. Add them in small batches to avoid matting (too many leaves clump together and slow down the compost process)
- Cover your pile or use an enclosed composter to keep things moist but not sodden. This will also deter pests like bears, raccoons, and mice.
- Other items that can go in your compost this time of year include wood ash and the skeletons of annual flowers & plants. Break down large-bodied plants like tomatoes and broccoli before adding them to your pile.
- Store compost material like leaves & grass in a burlap sack near your pile for adding with food scraps.




#### **Senator Irene Wrenner, Chittenden North** January 22, 2024

The Vermont Legislature gaveled back into session on January 3rd.

But thanks to summer floods, elected officials were also quite busy in the off session: fielding calls for assistance, meeting with committees, and drafting bills for recovery.

Certainly, other bills are being introduced. Several deal with such crises as homelessness, theft, and substance

abuse. All told, House Reps have introduced 311 bills in 2024; Senators have presented 144 bills, as of January 20th.



As I made my way from one booth to another on August 1st, I asked, "What laws do we need, or don't need? How can I help?"

"Child car seats" was the response from Lt. Allen Fortin of the Highway Safety Division and Sidney Bradley from the VT Health Department. Both men explained how existing statutes are NOT keeping our most vulnerable passengers safe.

Vermont's law isn't nearly as stringent as car seat manufacturers' stipulations.

Buckled-in babies are allowed to face forward too soon, I learned, leading to collision outcomes in which an entire family may walk away, except their infant or toddler dies or is seriously injured.

State Senator Ginny Lyons, who chairs Senate Health & Welfare, and I drafted a Child Safety Seat Bill that would increase the age at which a child can ride in a forward-facing seat, thus, catching Vermont up to other states.

We believe this bill, once passed, will prevent injuries and save young lives. We also believe such a law would reduce anguish and heartache among first responders and relatives, who would otherwise see worse outcomes from car accidents.

The Senate Transportation Committee invited me to introduce S.187 on January 16th. After discussion, members proposed adding this new child safety seat language to their large committee bill, rather than processing it separately.

I will continue to advocate for the provisions in S.187 and encourage my peers to pass new child safety seat regulations before the biennium ends in mid-May. I'll keep you posted! Meanwhile, please let me know what's on your mind: iwrenner@leg.state.vt.us.

The CWAC oversees the Chittenden County Regional Planning Commission activities and policy development regarding but not limited to, the Vermont Lake Champlain Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) Plan and its related plans and programs. #### **CCRPC Lamoille Basin Water Quality Council**

The responsibilities of a BWQC as outlined § 39-502 of the CWSP Rule are:

- (a) The purpose of a BWQC is to establish policy and make decisions for the CWSP regarding the most significant water d-quality impairments that exist in the basin and prioritizing the clean water projects that will address those impairments based on the basin plan.
- (b) When prioritizing clean water projects and prioritizing the most significant water quality impairments in the basin, the BWQC shall consult with the basin plan and CWSP and utilize the Agency's project selection protocols.
- (c) The BWQC shall participate in the basin planning process established in 10 V.S.A. § 1253(d). Potential members should be:
- knowledgeable on clean water topics for the applicable basin
- Interested in prioritizing and selecting non-regulatory clean water projects for funding at quarterly BWQC meetings
- Interested in participating in the applicable Tactical Basin Planning process

#### **REMINDERS FOR DOG OWNERS**

Winter can be a difficult time for dogs to go missing. To help ensure your furry companions are safe this winter you can do the following:

- Clear snow from against fencing to avoid over the fence escapes (as snow piles up it can be easier for your dog to go over).
- When your dog is let outside make sure they are wearing reflective and/or high visibility orange/yellow.
- Always make sure your dog is wearing a name tag with a phone number! If you find that dangling tags get lost easily look for "slide" style tags.
- If you use an invisible fence ensure your batteries are still in working order.
- Keep cable runs well lubricated to ensure they are working properly. Cable runs and tie-outs may require more moisture this time of year.
- Train and Maintain a reliable recall. Teaching your dog to come when called reliably is one of the best tools for keeping your dog safe this winter. Practice in a safe area before letting your dog loose. Please make sure that when in public your dog can reliably come when called even if distracted by: wildlife, people, children, livestock, and other dogs.
